#### FROM THE CHAIR

The Science and Technology Division Executive Board, committee chairs and liaisons have been working very hard over the summer and continuing their efforts into the fall, as we move toward our goals into the "Next Phase in the Information Revolution".

#### **Executive Board**

In a conference call held in early July, the Executive Board revised and approved the Division's Bylaws, Article I, Section III and Article IX, Section II (please see the bylaws changes in this issue).

The Board members also discussed several important issues over e-mail and telephone during the summer. These issues included *Sci-Tech News* Board changes, creating an electronic version of *Sci-Tech News*, reimbursement policy for the Executive Board members and the Sci-Tech Division conference planner.

#### Committees/Liaisons

Thanks to our Nominations Committee, this year we have four excellent and highly qualified candidates running for the chair-elect and treasurer positions. The proposed Sci-Tech Division Strategic Plan was completed and submitted by the Strategic Planning Committee. Currently it is under review by the Executive Board for approval. The Conference Planning Committee has been reviewing the abstracts received for the Sci-Tech Division's papers session and has already submitted programming time requests and topics to the SLA Conference Planning Committee. The International Relations

Committee is in the process of soliciting ideas for projects and activities for the committee this year. Marsha Saylor, our Chair-Elect, has been trying hard to increase the number of vendors that will support our Division's 2000 annual conference programs.

Goals and objectives from the Division's committee chairs and liaisons have been set for this year. The following describes goals and objectives proposed by Sci- Tech Division committee chairs and liaisons.

#### **Archivist**

As Division Archivist, Janet Hughes will update lists of Award Winners, Officers and the FAQ. She will retrieve and go through the microfiche obtained from SLA HQ for our 75th Anniversary celebrations, and see if there are any items of significance in the microfiche for the Archives.

#### **Awards Committee**

Robin Jourdan and her Awards Committee have been very busy re-writing and updating four on-going Sci-Tech Division Awards criteria and requirements. The committee also plans to participate with the Global 2000 Awards Committee, award and notify recipients, work with the Division Board to determine other awards, and participate with remaining Sci-Tech Division Board members as appropriate.

#### **Membership Committee**

The principle goals of the Membership Committee this year are to build the strength (retention) and increase the volume (recruitment) of the membership body of the Division.

Under the leadership of Nathalie Thirlwall,

the Membership Committee endeavors to continue to welcome new members and encourages them to become involved specifically in the Sci-Tech Division. In order to increase the Division's membership, the Committee will create a survey to send to inactive members to attempt to discover how the division could get them back as members. The knowledge gained by these efforts may aid us to gain a new group of potential members as well as to possibly win others back. The committee will create a survey to send to all members to find out what are the things that members particularly want to see their division involved with and what changes they would suggest. Building a strong division requires a good knowledge regarding the needs and expectations of the membership body.

In addition, articles will be sent to *Sci-Tech News* and possibly to some college and university papers encouraging students to join SLA and the Division. Special attention will be paid to ensure that minority groups feel they are welcome to join the Division.

#### **Projects and Publications Committee**

David Duggar and his committee's goals are: to create guidelines for actual review, recommendation, and funding of project proposals; to create an awareness of the Committee; to stimulate project activity; and to implement these activities during or by the end of the 1999-2000 year.

#### **SLA Affirmative Action Caucus Liaison**

The goals for Theo Jones-Quartey, SLA Affirmative Action Caucus Liaison, are to improve awareness of the Division among the ethnic minority and diverse members, and to establish connections with chapter affirmative action liaisons in order to provide an ongoing process for collaboration and marketing of our division to diverse members.

#### **Student Relations Committee**

This team, led by Mary Frances Lembo, has been working very hard to recruit more students to participate in the Student Relations Committee's mentoring program. Also, the committee is developing a presentation describing the Student Relations Committee's mentoring program for the annual conference and will write an abstract, develop its presentation and present it at the June 2000 annual conference.

The committee has begun to conduct

research on qualifications for sci-tech librarians as indicated by job advertisements. The committee will update the Newcomer's Brunch Directory, and plan program activities for the Newcomer's Brunch at the 2000 annual conference.

In addition, the committee will help to market the Cabeen travel stipend to library school students by making an initial notification to library schools, Division and Chapter bulletins.

#### **Farewell to Ellis Mount**

After the November issue of Sci-Tech News this year. Bonnie Osif, who has been the STN advertising manager for many years, will become our new editor, and Bette Stewart will serve as the bulletin's advertising manager. As we embrace new faces and talented professionals on the new STN Board, it is time for us to say "Good Bye" to Ellis Mount, our outstanding veteran News editor for the last decade. Thanks to his hard and dedicated efforts. STN was selected and is now indexed in H. W. Wilson's Library Literature. His leadership as the Sci-Tech News editor will be missed. However, I am delighted that Ellis Mount is willing to serve as the Chair of the Division's Government Relations Committee this year. He and Bonnie Osif will be working together in the remainder of the year on transferring techniques for the Sci- Tech News. He will continue to edit the book review section in Sci-Tech News, a task he tells us is one he particularly enjoys.

#### New STN Board and Its Goals

It is gratifying to know that four extremely well qualified people have agreed to serve on the *STN* Board. They are: Bonnie Osif, Editor; Bette Stewart, Advertising Manager; Suzanne Ogden, Subscriptions Manager; and Barbara Parkinson, Business Manager. Welcome to the new *STN* Board!

As the new editor, Bonnie Osif has already set up her goals to investigate a new publisher for STN. The major objectives will be to contain costs, especially for color printing, to consolidate the printing and mailing operations in one location, to investigate the use of desktop publishing for STN rather than word processing, to work with the Advertising Manager to develop a larger pool of advertisers, and finally to coordinate the migration of STN to a partial web publication with Joe Kraus, Web Master of the Division.

#### STN on the Internet

After many discussions among members of the Executive Board (all division chairs that are incorporated in *Sci-Tech News* were included), it was decided that the first electronic version of *STN* will be created for the February issue in 2000. The February electronic version will be a "test" version. Once the design and layout have been reviewed by the Board, the web pages will be moved to the regular section of the Sci-Tech web site. Joe Kraus and his Web Committee will co-operate with Bonnie Osif, new editor of *STN*, to work out the details in terms of how to "move the print" to the electronic version.

The electronic version of *STN* will include the following:


- a. The information describing the cover page we are still going to include unusual covers.)

- e. The list of advertisers for the print issue.





Mary Frances began by thanking last year's mentor volunteers (Nancy Anderson, Jill Hackenberg, Rosanne Macek, Eleanor MacLean, James Manasco, Jean Piety, John Sandy, Nathalie Thirlwall, Anna Ren and Mary Frances Lembo). Stephen McMinn made some brief remarks as chair of the Sci-Tech Division, welcoming the 30-40 attendees.

Mary Frances explained the directory distributed to the tables. The Communications section lists the Sci-Tech website address, listserv address and the editor and address of *Sci-Tech News*. The Organization section lists contact information for the division officers and committee chairs. The Participation section encourages the new members/students to get involved in the division. The Awards section describes the awards that are presented by the division. And, finally, the Mentors section lists and describes the mentors who have volunteered for this year.

Mary Frances then gave a history of the Mentor Program, with some comments and assistance from James Manasco. Last year, John Sandy, Mary Frances Lembo and James E. Manasco published an article entitled "Preparation for Sci-Tech Librarianship: Results of a Survey." Several respondents to this survey made the comment that having a sci-tech librarian as a mentor was a valuable experience. We decided to launch a mentor program at last year's Annual Conference. We sent out a call for volunteers and 10 people responded. These 10 people then acted as contact persons for several new members and students for the year. ### Overview of Data Mining and Its Importance to Librarians

10:30am-11:45am Monday June 7th Moderator: Sonia Cawsey McGowan, University of San Diego. Speaker: Caroline Crouch, University of Minnesota, Duluth (Website: http://www.d.umn.edu/~ccrouch/)

Data mining is a way of analyzing data. It includes the search for valuable information in large volumes of data and applying algorithms for extracting patterns from raw data. It is used by statisticians, database providers, business community, etc. Nonlinear models and neural nets are considered. Please see the website for further information. A very well attended program (the place was packed, 130-150 attendees).

### Is a Bibliographic Database Necessary at the Core? 4:30pm-6:00pm; Monday June 7th.

Moderator: Nancy Anderson, University of Illinois. Speakers: Jacqueline "Jay" Trolley, ISI; Gregg A. Silvis (subbing for Carol Carr, Univ. of Penn.), University of Delaware; Tim Ingoldsby, AIP; and Emily Mobley, Purdue University.

It concerned the question of whether a bibliographic layer is necessary in constructing an environment for immediate full text retrieval. Each of the four speakers tackled this question from their own viewpoints. Jay Trolley went first. She examined the history of bibliographic databases going back to the 1800's. In summary: the fundamental value of the bibliographic service is the ability to reach a wide variety of publications from a wide variety of publishers. In answer to the question: YES! But it needs to provide links to other resources. Tim Ingoldsby agreed and went on to say that the database needs to provide robust access to the online search facility and that publishers should participate in efforts to improve the search process. Gregg Silvis then spoke briefly on his view of the question. But, it was Emily Mobley's presentation that brought down the house. She was entertaining as well as informative. Some points: Cafeteria Plan: Choose the most appropriate model for the needs of the patrons. Open Linking System: No matter what database,

should link transparently to the electronic journal. In Physics 90-95% of research will be available at the desktop later this year. Another very well attended program (100-115 attendees in a too small room).

### SCIENCE-TECHNOLOGY DIVISION BYLAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

With the upcoming election ballots, ST Division members will be asked to vote on whether to make the following proposed amendments to the Division Bylaws.

#### ARTICLE I: NAME AND OBJECTIVES

SECTION 3: [Additional objectives of this Division shall be to draw together those members of Special Libraries Association having an interest in the role of library and information science as applied to the recording, retrieval and dissemination of knowledge and information in all areas of science and technology; and to promote and improve the communication, dissemination and use of such knowledge for the benefit of libraries and their users.]

SECTION 3: The Division's objectives include developing a community of members having an interest in library and information science as it applies to all areas of science and technology. The Division promotes the exchange of ideas, disseminates information beneficial to members, and makes educational opportunities available to its members for continued professional development.

#### ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1: [The membership of the Science Technology Division shall be open to all those members of the Special Libraries Association defined by the Association Bylaws who elect to affiliate with the Division. The official news bulletin of the Division shall be sent free to all members.]

SECTION 1: The membership of the Division shall be those members of the Association who elect to affiliate with the Division.

SECTION 2: [Members, Associate Members, and Retired Members of the Association who are members of the Division shall have the right to vote and to hold any elective or appointive office in the Division and to receive the Division bulletin free.]

SECTION 3: [Student Members of the Association who are members of the Division shall have the right to vote and to hold any appointive, but not elective, office in the Division...]

SECTION 2: Members, Associate Members, and Retired Members of the Association who are members of the Division shall have the right to vote, to hold any elective or appointive office in the Division and to receive the Division bulletin free.

SECTION 3: Student Members of the Association who are members of the Division shall have the right to vote, to hold any appointive, but not elective, office in the Division, and to receive the Division bulletin free.

#### ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

SECTION 1: The Chair shall be the chief executive officer of the Division and, subject to the Executive Board, shall have general supervision and control over its affairs; shall preside at all business meetings of the Division and of the Executive Board; shall recommend to the Board measures considered desirable to further the objectives and broaden the effectiveness of the Division. The Chair and the Secretary shall sign all contracts and legal documents. Unless determined otherwise by the Executive Board, the Chair and the Treasurer shall sign all checks drawn upon Division funds.

The Chair shall be responsible for the Science-Technology Division program at the Annual Conference; shall be a member exofficio without vote of all committees except the Nominating Committee. [The Chair shall represent the

Division at meetings of the Division Cabinet during the Association Year or, if unable to attend, shall designate a Member, Associate Member or Retired Member of the Division to serve as alternate representative.] The Chair shall prepare the annual summary of Division activities for the Division Cabinet Officers, the Division Annual Business Meeting, and the Science-Technology Division Advisory Committee; shall prepare additional reports as may be required by the Association; and shall be responsible for supervising the preparation of such reports as may be required of other Division Officers by the Association.

SECTION 2: [The Chair Elect helps the Chair accomplish the Chair's duties and shall represent the Division at meetings of the Division Cabinet held during the Association Year. In the event of absence or withdrawal of the Chair, all duties and obligations of the Chair, not otherwise provided for in these bylaws, shall be assumed by the Chair Elect.] The Chair-Elect shall prepare a report on activities to be presented at the Division Annual Business Meeting.

SECTION 4. [The Treasurer shall have eustody of the Division funds. The Treasurer and the Chair shall sign all checks drawn upon—Division funds unless otherwise determined by the Executive Board. The Treasurer shall furnish such financial statements as may be required by the Executive Board, the Chair and the Association and shall submit a statement of account of its monies to each subunit in January of each year.]

The Chair shall represent the Division at meetings of the Division Cabinet and the <u>Joint Cabinet</u> during the Association Year or, if unable to attend, shall designate a Member, Associate Member or Retired Member of the Division to serve as alternate representative

#### The Chair-Elect shall:

- assist the Chair in the
performance of the duties of the Chair
-represent the Division, together with
the Chair; at meetings of the Division
Cabinet and Joint Cabinet during the
Association Year in which the office is held;
and

<u>-assume all the duties and</u> <u>obligations of the Chair in the event of</u> absence or withdrawal of the Chair.

SECTION 4: The Treasurer shall:

-have custody of the Division funds;

-sign all checks drawn upon
Division funds as co-signatory with the
Chair, unless determined otherwise by the
Executive Board; and

-furnish such financial statements
as may be required by the Executive Board,
the Chair, and the Association.

#### ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

SECTION 2. The Chair of the Division shall appoint the members and designate the Chair of each Committee except the Advisory Committee and the Nominating Committee. Appointment to Standing Committees shall be for one year unless determined otherwise by the Executive Board. No member may serve continuously on any one committee in excess of six years.

This limitation on terms of office does not apply to the Archivist or *Sci-Tech News* positions.

#### ARTICLE VIII: FUNDS, CONTRACTS AND PROPERTY

SECTION 2. Any agreement, contract, or obligation entered into by the Division, including the purchase of property, shall have advance approval of the Executive Board. If cost of property (such as office machines, filing cabinets, computer equipment, etc.) exceeds \$1,000.00, it shall have the advance approval of the Division members. If any cost or liability exceeds [\$2,000.00] the transaction must be reviewed and signed by the Association's Executive Director; any which exceeds the Division's available or budgeted funds requires advance approval by the Association's Board of Directors. All affiliate and contractual relationships shall be directed toward the best interest of the Division and Association and shall protect the property and identity of the Division and the Association.

ARTICLE IX: NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

SECTION 2. Each year the Nominating Committee shall present at least one candidate for Chair-Elect and at least one candidate for either Secretary or Treasurer, the latter two offices to be filled in alternate years. The Committee will make every effort to nominate two candidates for every office. However, if two candidates can not be found who agree to stand for election for an office. the Committee may submit a single candidate for that office. The Committee shall obtain the written acceptance of each nominee prior to submission of its report. [The report of the Nominating Committee shall be published at least 90 days before the annual business meeting. Further nominations accompanied by written acceptance of the nominee may be added to the ballot by petition of 30 Division members and shall be filed with the Nominating Committee at least 60 days before the Annual Business Meeting.]

The report of the Nominating Committee shall be published at least 105 days before the annual business meeting. Further nominations accompanied by written acceptance of the nominee may be added to the ballot by petition of 30 Division members and shall be filed with the Nominating Committee at least 75 days before the Annual Business Meeting.

Background: In 1997, the Science-Technology Division had the experience of having to select a replacement candidate for a submitted nominee. This situation occurred after the candidate had been nominated and the slate announced. Replacing the nominee was outside of the time frame for providing information to Division members. In order to address this situation in the future, the following proposals are being made. It is hereby proposed thatSECTION 2A: If the candidate for any office withdraws before taking office the procedure for

nominations and elections must be re-opened.

The deadlines may be waived and if
necessary the elections will be held during the
Annual Business Meeting. The method of
taking a vote at the Annual Business Meeting
may be by majority vote of the members
present.

If the position vacated is that of the Chair, the Chair-Elect shall automatically ascend to the level of Chair. Should both Chair and Chair-Elect be vacated, the Secretary shall automatically and temporarily ascend to the level of Chair. Full powers of the Chair will be available to the Secretary until a replacement has been elected and assumes Division responsibility.

SECTION 3. [Election shall be by secret ballot mailed to each Division member at least 45 days before the annual business meeting.] The candidate who receives the largest number of votes for any office shall be elected. In the event of a tie election shall be by majority vote of the members present at the annual business meeting.

There shall be an election only if the slate includes more than one candidate for any office, and it shall be by secret ballot in paper format. Ballots shall be mailed to each Division member at least 60 days before the Division

Annual Business Meeting.
