AIAA SEEKING PAPERS ON THE VALUE OF INFORMATION FOR THEIR 1992 RENO CONFERENCE DONALD H. PETERSEN

The AIAA Technical Committee for Technical Information is sponsoring INFO/EXPO '92, an information services exposition, and a technical session on the "Value of Information and Value-Added Processes in Information Management," at the 30th Aerospace Sciences Meeting to be held January 6-9, 1992, in Reno, NV.

The annual AIAA Aerospace Sciences Meeting is primarily a technical meeting along with a vendor exhibition of advanced computational equipment. About 1500-1700 registrants attend the 125-plus sessions during this four-day meeting. The engineers and scientists are information users, and it is the desire of the AIAA Technical Committee for Technical Information to create a forum for dialog between those who supply information-related services and the technical information end-user. We would hope that SLA members who are recognized in the area of value of information would also be willing to share their knowledge and ideas with the aerospace engineering community. This will be the second technical program sponsored by the Committee focusing on the application of electronic information resources to science and engineering. Papers are solicited on the utilization of basic and applied technical information.

Suggested areas of interest include but are not limited to:

- 1) Models and methodology for assessing the value of information
- 2) Value-added processes in information management
- 3) Information resource cost factors and their control
- 4) Descriptions of productive utilization of information

- 5) Importance of information in program management
- 6) Technical information for competitive analysis and planning
- 7) CD-ROM technology
- 8) New methodologies for information manipulation and interpretation.
