## Criss-Cross Directory

Back by popular demand! The *Criss-Cross Directory* — Volume 2 should be coming off the

press this month. For those of you who have depended on the first edition for cross referencing AD - N numbers, Volume 2 promises to be even better. It will continue the cross of AD - N numbers from 1979-1986, as well as continue to cross NASA report numbers to N numbers. In addition, however, Volume 2 will cross N - AD numbers from 1962-1986.

In this technological age, one might ask "Why buy this tool when I can get these numbers from NASA/RECON?" For one thing, the directory saves time. Looking up the number leaves out the ordeal of logging on or waiting to use the terminal if it is already being accessed. Patrons especially appreciate this efficiency when waiting at a counter or on the phone. Another plus is that no online skills are required, thus allowing all levels of staff access to the information.

This has been done at Lockheed in Sunnyvale, CA, prior to the directory. Many years ago, the reports acquisitions librarian kept a card file crossing AD numbers to the N numbers which the library received. Although this was never maintained beyond the AD-900 series, it continued to be used for many subsequent years because it provided quick and easy information.

The *Criss-Cross Directory* provides the logical, efficient solution for this kind of information, thus freeing librarians and computer termi-

nals for more subject related searches.

## Report Code Identification

Another valuable resource which has finally returned, as you are probably aware, is the *Reports Series Codes Dictionary*, 3rd ed., which was edited by Eleanor J. Aronson and is being published by Gale Research Company. It is an update to the SLA publication *Dictionary of Report Series Codes*, 2nd ed., 1973. This valuable tool provides a link between issuing agencies and report codes in an effort to more easily identify technical report literature.

The print and formatting make the new edition easier to access, however, one missing feature is the "see also" references that indicated an organization's name change. Also, sources which may have been prefaced by the governmental parent body, such as Great Britain, are now accessed more directly by the name of the organization itself.

According to Gale Research Company, this dictionary will be updated periodically.

been meeting for a monthly lunch for the past year. The meetings have ranged from hearing speakers discuss contract administration, procedures for acquiring those hard to find "required" documents, local document delivery services to informal group discussions on DTIC conferences attended, local automated systems, and sources of technical literature. Perhaps the most popular question is not "How do I order that?" but "How do I actually receive the document?" The average lunch includes about 15-20 people, however new faces continue to join and old members reappear.

Another example of sharing resources can be within the formal structure of a company or corporation. Lockheed Corporation established the Lockheed Information Task Force on Technical Information Management to better meet the corporation's growing information needs. Linda Gabriel, supervisor of the Technical Information Center at Lockheed Electronics Company in New Jersey, currently chairs this committee. The main project of the committee at present is to combine various Lockheed company library catalogs into one central database. The end result will allow users to access the collection using menu-driven software as well as provide librarians additional resources within the corporate structure for filling requests. Although the librarians are located across the country from New Jersey to Georgia to California, communication is maintained through teleconference committee meetings and training sessions as well as through the IBM Profs electronic mail system.

All of you are involved in exchanging ideas through networkings to some degree. Perhaps many of you using an invisible network don't think about its unseen structure. You just know "This is what I need and this is who I call."

So whatever type of interactions you're involved in, from highly structured to very informal, please write and share your experiences so that we may include additional examples in the next issue.
