Letter from William Green to John Green June 16th 1798 [Green Family Mss. – A.L.S.]


Cumberland June 16th 1798

Dear Brother

I have received your letters by Meller this morning in Providence & am now at Cumberland in persuit [sic] of the old dun who has made her escape from the pasture night before last. I am now twelve miles from Providence & have heard nothing of her[.] [I]f she comes to Worcester you will send us word the first opportunity for I am in the figets [sic] & sister likewise. I shall make all search for her & send you word when I find her if I do – you will not suppose she could have gotten far from home without seeing her. All friends are well.
