President's Award - M. Fredric Rieders, Ph.D. '85

M. Fredric Rieders, Ph.D. is Vice Chairman of the Board, Corporate Treasurer, Assistant Lab Director and a Forensic Scientist at NMS Labs in Willow Grove, PA, an internationally accredited private, independent clinical toxicology and forensic science laboratory that performs DNA, serology, toxicology, drug chemistry, and expert testimony for the global criminal and civil justice system. NMS Labs is the leading provider of innovative, diagnostic toxicology and other specialty clinical lab services to the US National Reference Lab Network. Dr. Rieders is a CLIA licensed Laboratory Director in Pennsylvania and New York.

Dr. Rieders is a Fellow of The American Academy of Forensic Sciences, a member of the Society of Forensic Toxicologists, The International Association of Forensic Toxicologists, the World Association of Medical Law, the American Association of Clinical Chemistry, and an Affiliate Member of The



National Association of Medical Examiners where he serves on their Foundation Board. He served on Pennsylvania's Commission on Wrongful Convictions where he worked with the Forensic Science Subcommittee on recommendations to improve the forensic science investigation system. Rieders served as the Chief Forensic Archeotoxicologist on the Confederate Submarine Hunley crew excavation and analysis team in Charleston, SC. Dr. Rieders has qualified as an Expert in Forensic Toxicology and testified in numerous criminal, civil and arbitration proceedings.

Dr. Rieders earned a B.A. in Chemistry from Arcadia University in 1980 and a PhD in Pharmacology/Toxicology from Thomas Jefferson University in 1985 where he was active as volunteer faculty and lectured in Toxicology for over a decade. He is past President of the Jefferson College of Graduate Studies Alumni Association where he was honored as Distinguished Alumnus. He is active in promoting Jefferson's academic mission through his families' financial support of the Hamilton Building, Graduate Student Lounge, Fredric Rieders Scholarship, Distinguished Graduate Award and Faculty Prize.

Rieders served as a Term Trustee on the Arcadia University Board, and as a volunteer faculty member serving as a course director and lecturer in Toxicology at Arcadia's Masters of Forensic Science Program since 2004. He serves on the Board of Directors for the National Forensic Science Technology Center (NFSTC) in Largo, Florida; the Advisory Board for the Cyril H. Wecht Institute of Forensic Science and Law at Duquesne University School of Law; Chairman of the Board of Advisors and Fellows at The Henry C. Lee Institute of Forensic Sciences at New Haven University in West Haven, Connecticut; and is Chairman of the Foundation Board of Trustees of the Fredric Rieders Family Renaissance Foundation and Chief Scientific Officer for the Forensics Mentors Institute in Willow Grove, PA. Fredric is a Board member of The Vidocq Society, the premier US cold murder case investigations organization which examines cases and assist law enforcement agencies in identifying leads that may help solve homicides. He was awarded the H E Filinger, MD Medal for Lifetime Achievement by The Vidocq Society in 2013.

Dr. Rieders was an editor of the Pennsylvania Academy of Sciences publication Science Technology and National Security, wrote a chapter in Forensic Aspects of Chemical Terrorism and recently published an article on his work with NASA: "Management of a Potentially Toxic Accidental Trialkylamine Ingestion during Spaceflight"in Aviation, Space and Environmental Medicine.

Rieders is currently working as Executive Producer on a film about Salvador Dali and the use of DNA in art fraud investigations. He was featured as a Forensic Science Investigator in the BBC film "How Sherlock Holmes Changed the World of Forensic Science" and Smithsonian Channel's "Forensic Firsts: Proving Poison". He is a frequent guest speaker and presenter at numerous conferences and seminars.

Dr. Rieders was Knighted by the Royal House of Portugal and was awarded the Medal of Merit from the Military Order of St. Michael of the Wing; on May 1, 2015 he was honored by The Royal House of Portugal with the Vila Vicosa Medal of Merit and inducted into the Royal Honor Guard.

Doctor of Science - Esther Dyson, Sc.D., F.A.S.H.P.

Esther Dyson, Sc.D. (hon.), F.A.S.H.P., is the founder of the Health Initiative Coordinating Council (HICCup), an established non-profit since 2013 that encourages a rethinking of how we produce health. HICCup, under the direction of Ms. Dyson, is undergoing The Way to Wellville Project – a national challenge among five communities over five years to make significant, visible and lasting improvement in five measures of health and economic vitality.

Ms. Dyson is the author of the best-selling book, *Release 2.0: A Design for Living in the Digital Age* (Broadway Books, 1996), a novel on how the Internet affects individuals' lives. She is an active member of a number of non-profit and advisory organizations including the Long Now Foundation, the Sunlight Foundation and the Personal Genome Project. In 2004, she served as the founding chairman of ICANN, the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers.



Devoted to angel investing, Ms. Dyson sits on the boards and continues to invest in various health and technology start-ups such as Applied Proteomics, Genomera, HealthEngage, Health Loop, Organized Wisdom and PatientsLikeMe. She has spent the last two years furthering her education not just in nutrition and diabetes management, but also on school food procurement, "non-emergent transportation" and Jail-Acquired Insolvency – the justice system's response to health care's hospital-acquired infection.

Ms. Dyson received her Bachelor's Degree in Economics from Harvard University in 1974. Her passion for continuous learning evolved from her first job as a fact-checker for *Forbes Magazine*. She then spent the next five years on Wall Street as a Securities Analyst for various, renowned corporations such as Apple Computer and Federal Express. She composed and edited *Release 1.0*, a monthly analysis of the PC and Internet business, and ran the yearly PC Forum, the industry's leading executive conference as head of her own company, EDventure Holdings, until 2004.

Doctor of Science - Ignazio R. Marino, M.D.

Ignazio Roberto Marino, M.D., Sc.D. (hon.), F.A.S.H.P., is the current mayor of Rome, Italy, a position he has held since 2013. Appointed by the Government of Italy, he is one of five board members of the first National Center for Transplantation of the Italian Republic. Dr. Marino was also appointed by Pope John Paul II as an international expert to advise the ethics committee, known as the Pontifical Academy for Life.

Formerly, Dr. Marino was the Director of the Division of Liver Transplantation and Hepatobiliary Surgery, as well as the Director of the Division of Transplantation at Thomas Jefferson University Hospitals. Dr. Marino also held multiple faculty and director positions throughout medical centers and universities across Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Palermo, Italy.



After graduating summa cum laude in Medicine and Surgery from the Catholic University of Rome, he became board certified in General and Vascular Surgery, spending four years training in the Transplantation Institute of the University of Cambridge and the Pittsburgh Transplant Institute.

Honorably, Dr. Marino was part of the team in Pittsburgh that developed the clinical use of FK506, now known as Tacrolimus. This revolutionary drug has practically replaced any other immunosuppressant used worldwide in liver transplantation. He also participated in the first stomach, liver, pancreas and intestine transplantation on a human being in the history of medicine.

As a surgical team member, Dr. Marino performed the only two baboon-to-human liver xenotransplants in medical history. He also led the analysis of the largest clinical series of liver transplants ever reported, identifying ten different variables associated with transplant outcomes.

Dr. Marino has authored eleven books and more than 700 publications in the most renowned scientific journals dedicated to surgery and transplantation. He serves on the editorial boards of over ten publications, is a member of 31 scientific societies, three of which he is a founding member, and has been awarded over 120 prizes and recognitions of his work.

Sidney Kimmel

Sidney Kimmel was born and raised in Philadelphia, and the philanthropic footprint he has created here evidences an unparalleled devotion to his hometown. From his very humble roots, first in South then West Philadelphia, Mr. Kimmel went on to found the Jones Apparel Group, developing it into a New York Stock Exchange company and one of the world's leading designers and marketers of branded apparel, footwear and accessories. His first job in the garment industry was as an inventory clerk and later a traveling salesman for a women's-wear manufacturer. From there, he joined the iconic clothing company Villager, rising through the ranks to become its president and CEO. In 1970, Mr. Kimmel established his own clothing line, Jones New York, targeting young career women and, during the 70s and 80s, became one of the major players in the women's apparel industry. Jones went public in 1991, adding many notable brands to its line, including Anne Klein, Nine West, Gloria Vanderbilt and Stuart Weitzman, among others; Jones also owned Barneys New York. In April, 2014, The Jones Group was sold for \$2.2 billion.



As early as 2002, Business Week recognized that Mr. Kimmel had already given more than half of his fortune to philanthropic works and had committed to giving the balance of his estate to further those efforts, a distinction that put him among a very select group of the nation's wealthiest. In 2010, he readily signed the Giving Pledge, the Warren Buffett and Bill Gates initiative encouraging America's billionaires to contribute half of their wealth to charitable endeavors.

Of the \$850 million-plus that Mr. Kimmel has given away, more than \$550 million has gone to cancer research. He established the Kimmel Scholars Program, which funds young, innovative cancer scientists with their earliest grants to stimulate their research and advance their careers. With 262 award recipients to date, the Program has launched the next generation of the nation's leading cancer researchers. Major gifts also subsidized cancer research and care at the Sidney Kimmel Comprehensive Cancer Center at Johns Hopkins, the Sidney Kimmel Center for Prostate and Urologic Cancers at Memorial Sloan Kettering, research programs championed by the Stand Up To Cancer effort, and much more.

Mr. Kimmel has also made substantial gifts to organizations promoting the arts, education, health sciences and Jewish continuity. In Philadelphia, his philanthropic leadership established the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, and he provided endowment gifts to the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia and the Raymond and Ruth Perelman Jewish Day School. The Kimmel Theater in the National Constitution Center is named in his honor, and he is also lead donor to the National Museum of American Jewish History.

Mr. Kimmel has been an extremely generous benefactor to Jefferson, providing cornerstone funding to establish the Sidney Kimmel Cancer Center as well as transformational support for research into the prevention of cardiovascular disease. His most recent forward-thinking gift—the largest in Jefferson's history—to name the Sidney Kimmel Medical College demonstrates Mr. Kimmel's appreciation of Jefferson's 190-year tradition of medical excellence and his confidence in Jefferson's path-breaking leadership in the future of healthcare.

Recognizing the fundamental importance of medical education and the impact of additional philanthropy, a significant portion of this landmark gift was set aside to establish the Kimmel Matching Program. This unique opportunity will provide a match for donors who establish new endowed scholarships and professorships. The Kimmel Matching Program already has inspired other philanthropists to give generously in support of medical education. During this academic year, seven new endowed scholarships have been created with help from the program, which has provided \$1.2 million in match funding.

Mr. Kimmel and his wife, Caroline, reside in California and New York.

The University Mace

Originally a medieval weapon, the mace evolved from a short staff weighted with metal (used for breaking armor) into a bejeweled and sculptural relic. In one of the earliest ceremonial uses of the mace, it was carried by the royal bodyguard before the French king in the 1200s. It fell into disuse by the 16th century as firearms made protective armor and some hand-to-hand combat weapons obsolete. Examples of the mace as a symbol of authority in modern government include its use in the British House of Commons where the ceremonial mace has a presence on the Treasury table, and in the U.S. House of Representatives, where it is placed on a pedestal to the right of the Speaker's podium when the House is convened. Universities also used the ceremonial mace, borne by the chief marshal, during academic processions.

The Thomas Jefferson University Mace, carried for the first time in the 1986 commencement ceremonies by Grand Marshal Robert Mandle, Ph.D., was designed and cast by Howard Serlick, member of the Guild of Mastercraftsmen, Winterthur Scholar and Chief Conservator (Gilding) of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. It was crafted by silversmith Eugene Zweigle and woodturner Michael Copeland.

The four-foot-long, 14-pound mace is made of ebony highlighted with lapis lazuli to reflect Jefferson's colors (black and blue). It features a miniature of Henry Mitchell's sculpture, the "Winged Ox of Saint Luke," symbol of Saint Luke the Physician, the original of which stands on campus beside the Scott Building on Walnut Street. The miniature was cast in silver by Zweigle.

Mitchell's original statue of the "Winged Ox," adopted by the University in 1976 as its symbol of clinical excellence, is mounted on a column containing the names of 50 medical scientists who have most advanced the art of healing. It also reflects the historical evolution of Thomas Jefferson University from its beginnings as Jefferson Medical College in 1824 to its current status as an academic institution comprising the Sidney Kimmel Medical College, the Jefferson Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, the Jefferson School of Health Professions, the Jefferson School of Nursing, the Jefferson School of Pharmacy and the Jefferson School of Population Health.

The mace, a grand emblem of the University's heritage, is carried at the head of all formal academic processions.

Presidential Medallion of Thomas Jefferson University

The President's Medallion was created in 2009 during the tenure of Robert L. Barchi, M.D., Ph.D., the fourth President of Thomas Jefferson University. It replaced the previous, well-worn President's Medallion made in 1977, which had depicted four old corporate seals used in various eras of the institution's history.

The current medallion was designed and crafted by Tiffany & Company, New York. It consists of a sterling silver medallion suspended from a heavy, silver double-link chain. The medallion's obverse depicts the University seal, a bas-relief profile of Thomas Jefferson, and the surround reads, "THOMAS JEFFERSON UNIVERSITY – 1824," the year the institution was founded. The reverse is engraved with the names of the four University Presidents.

Silver is a metal long-associated with medicine and is recognized to have antibacterial properties. Hippocrates (ca. 300 BCE) acknowledged the healing powers of silver and the ancients used silver bottles to keep water or wine from spoiling. The expression "born with a silver spoon in your mouth" comes from the Middle Ages when the wealthy gave their children silver spoons to suck on to prevent disease.

Like many academic traditions, the display of a heavy "chain of office" comes down to us from medieval regalia and represents the weight of responsibility for the wearer. The chain itself connotes strength in unity, as well as strong communication.

The Presidential Medallion is worn by the President at all convocations of the University.

The Jefferson Processional

The Jefferson Processional was commissioned by the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College, now named the Sidney Kimmel Medical College, and played for the first time on November 15, 1974, at the Sesquicentennial Celebration of the Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University. This piece was presented to Thomas Jefferson University by the President of the Alumni Association, John J. Gartland, M.D. It was composed by Burle Marx.

Academic Regalia

The attire worn at academic ceremonies evolved from the dress worn by clergy in the 12th and 13th centuries. In 1222, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Stephen Langston, decreed that a closed, flowing gown known as the cappa clausa be worn by all clerics within his jurisdiction. Because Oxford and Cambridge were within the provinces of Canterbury, the clerks at both institutions adopted this style of attire. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap.

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities, on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress in 1895, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by practically all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the associate's, bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees and, at the same time, recognize the university which has conferred the degree.

The associate in arts and bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are worn closed. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away, and is worn open or closed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn open or closed. The majority of gowns are black, but a number of institutions have adopted other colors to identify special programs or groups within that institution.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the doctoral degree, 42 inches for the master's and 36 inches for the bachelor's and associate's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the doctoral, master's and bachelor's hoods is usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted. The associate's hood does not have a velvet border. The outside is black.

Black mortarboards are most commonly worn; four-sided and six-sided tams of various colors are also used.

Some of the colors in the bindings of the hoods are:
