

Providence November 24th 1795

Dear Brother

I wrote you last by Mr. Woods, who
was taken sick at Leicester, & could not carry the things, which I sent
by him, to your house. He says he sent them ~~to you~~ by somebody,
who left them at your house, before he returned, back here.
The things that I sent by him, were 3 gowns, & a muffle, ^{& 2 jackets,} for
sister Pers. I wish you would write, by the ^{next} opportunity,
whether you have received them or not, & send the money which I wrote
in the letter, I sent by him, the sum was 5 dollars which I want
very much, & should feel very happy, if you could send it next week,
by the stage. I have had no letters from our brothers, as yet,
but I expect one this week, by the packet. I have no news to write;
except that there are a great many sick, here at present. but they
are getting better. I remain your loving brother Wm. Green

I have had no letters from our brothers, as yet, but I expect one this week, by the packet. I have no news to write; except that there are a great many sick, here at present, but they are getting better. I remain your loving brother Wm. Green[.]
