The Problem:

THERE ARE 30,000 REGISTERED REFUGEES IN KUTUPALONG AND NAYAPARA CAMPS AND AN ESTIMATED 200,000 UNDOCUMENTED ROHINGYA LIVING OUTSIDE THE CAMPS WITH LITTLE ACCESS TO HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE. (UNHCR, 2013, 2017)

Refugee children are exposed to violence, child abuse, poor sanitation conditions, lack of education, diseases, lack of food and water, and traumatic events. This can contribute to mental illnesses, malnutrition, and trauma-related disorders.

Prolonged exposure to violence can lead to anxiety, sleeplessness, nightmares in the short-term, and neurological and behavioral dysfunction, including juvenile delinquency and criminal behavior, in the long-term. (Hawilo, 2015)

WHO ARE WE?

We are the *Children's Community Center*, a NGO that wants to provide an emergency response to the new surge of Rohingya refugee children. We want to relieve the daily mental traumas of the refugee camps through the collaborative interaction of the different children within the camps. This center will also give parents the space to focus on their own healing without the preoccupation of childcare.
