The William F. Kellow Award established by the late Emeritus Dean. This award is a copy of The Art of Medical care and Caring, a book of essays on the art of medical practice.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE—SIDNEY WEINHOUSE

Sidney Weinhouse, an internationally known scholar and cancer researcher, Emeritus Professor of Biochemistry and former Director of the Fels Research Institute of Temple University School of Medicine, was born in Chicago, Illinois. He was educated at the University of Chicago, earning his Bachelor of Science Degree in 1933 and Doctor of Philosophy Degree in 1936. From 1936 to 1941 he was first Loman Fellow and then Eli Lilly Fellow in Chemistry. During World War II, Doctor Weinhouse contributed his expertise to the Office of Scientific Research Development.

Doctor Weinhouse began his association with Temple University in 1947 as Biochemical Research Director of the Temple University Research Institute. In 1950 he joined the Institute for Cancer Research, where he served first as head of the Department of Metabolic Chemistry and later as Chairman of the Division of Biochemistry. In 1961 he returned to Temple University as Professor of Biochemistry and Associate Director of the Fels Research Institute of the School of Medicine; two years later he assumed the directorship, a position held until his retirement in 1976. He was appointed Emeritus Professor in 1977.

Sidney Weinhouse has contributed to our understanding of several basic biochemical phenomena. He is the author of more than two hundred scientific papers, has served on the editorial boards of a number of research journals and was the editor of the prestigious journal Cancer Research. He currently is Associate Editor of Cancer Research and co-editor of forty volumes of Advances in Cancer Research.

He has also served on many advisory councils for the federal government and academic research institutes including the National Institutes of Health, the Damon Runyon Memorial Fund for Cancer Research, and the American Cancer Society. He also serves currently as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cancer Society and the American Association for Cancer Research.

Doctor Weinhouse has been honored by election to the National Academy of Sciences and the Japanese Association for Cancer Research. He is the recipient of the G. H. A. Clowes Award from the American Association for Cancer Research, the Papanicolau Award for Cancer Research, the Lucy Wortham James Award from the Society of Surgical Oncology, and the Annual National Award of the American Cancer Society. Doctor Weinhouse has been awarded honorary degrees from Temple University, The Medical College of Pennsylvania, and the University of Chieti, Italy.

DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS—FRANCIS CLARK WOOD

Francis Clark Wood was born in Wellington, Cape Province, South Africa, in 1901. He received his undergraduate education at Princeton University and in 1926, was awarded the degree of Doctor of Medicine from the University of Pennsylvania. He continued his postgraduate training as an intern and cardiology fellow at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

From 1942 through 1945, Doctor Wood served in the United States Armed Forces and rose to Colonel and Chief of the Medical Service at the Twentieth General Hospital in Assam, India.

In 1947, Doctor Wood was appointed Professor of Medicine and Chairman of the Department of Medicine at the medical school of the University of Pennsylvania. He served in this role until 1964. In 1970, he was appointed as an Emeritus Professor of Medicine.

Doctor Wood has been active in many professional and scientific organizations. He has been Chairman of the Research Committee of the American Heart Association, President of the Association of American Physicians, and President of The College of Physicians of Philadelphia. Doctor Wood is best known as a superb clinician and teacher. Genetically, he has contributed to two outstanding physicians, his two sons. Spiritually, he is responsible for hundreds of other graduates from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine, who developed their concept of "medicine" from him. The medical students and residents at the University of Pennsylvania were part of his family, and they learned that humane, as well as scientific, awareness makes medicine an honored profession. In 1976, this particular talent was recognized when Doctor Wood received the Distinguished Teacher Award of the American College of Physicians.

Doctor Wood has received many other awards and honors, including election to Phi Beta Kappa, Alpha Omega Alpha, and Sigma Chi. He has received honorary Doctor of Science Degrees from Trinity College, Dublin, Princeton University, and the University of Pennsylvania. In 1981, the Association of Professors of Medicine presented the Robert A. Williams Award to him for being the Distinguished Chairman of Medicine.

DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS—JOHN A. D. COOPER

John A. D. Cooper is one of the nation's most respected leaders in medical education. As the first full-time President in the one hundred seven year history of the Association of American Medical Colleges, he has charted new goals for the education of medical students and has indicated ways these might be approached. For five consecutive years he has been selected by the editors of U.S. News and World Report as one of the five "most influential leaders in the field of health". This honor is justly deserved. Doctor Cooper has devoted a lifetime to science and medical education and continues to add to his laurels in his fifteenth year as President of the Association.

Born in Texas as World War I ended, he showed an early interest in science and earned his Baccalaureate Degree in Chemistry at New Mexico State University in 1939. He then went to Northwestern University where he was awarded a Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Biochemistry in 1943 and joined the faculty as an Instructor in Biochemistry. Without interrupting his teaching and research career, he earned his Doctor of Medicine Degree from Northwestern in 1951 and was promoted to Associate Professor of Biochemistry.

Doctor Cooper continued his academic career as Professor of Biochemistry, Dean of Sciences and Associate Dean of Faculties at Northwestern until 1969 when he moved to Washington, D.C. where he began his second career, that of President of the Association of American Medical Colleges. He continues to evidence his love of teaching and has a faculty appointment at Georgetown University. He is a true scholar with more than two hundred papers published in his areas of interest.

Doctor Cooper also continues to serve on federal advisory boards, university groups, and many national and international committees concerned with medical education, health, and research. He is President of the National Resident Matching Program, a member of the Special Medical Advisory Group of the Veterans Administration, and serves on the boards of the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates and the National Board of Medical Examiners.

In addition to his role as an educator and medical statesman, he has found time to be a father and a grandfather. One of his four children is a physician, and two of the others are in medically-related fields.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The wearing of academic dress dates back to the early days of the oldest universities in the world. In the American Council on Education's book entitled "American University and Colleges" it is suggested that "gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head..."

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities, on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress in 1895, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by almost all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the Associates, Bachelors, Masters, and Doctors and at the same time recognize the university which has given them the degree. Revisions to the code have occurred from time to time.

The Associate in Arts and Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are worn closed. The Master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away, and is worn open or closed. The Doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn opened or closed. Cotton poplin or similar material is used for the Associate's, Bachelor's and Master's degrees, and rayon or silk ribbed material is used for the Doctor's degree. The majority of gowns are black but a number of institutions have adopted other colors to identify special programs or groups within the institution.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the Doctor's degree, 42 inches for the Master's, and 36 inches for the Bachelor's and Associate's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the Doctor's, Master's and Bachelor's hoods are usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted. The Associate of Arts hood has no velvet border. The outside is black,

Black mortarboards are most commonly worn; six-sided tams of various colors may be used.

THE JEFFERSON PROCESSIONAL

The Jefferson Processional was commissioned by the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College and played for the first time on November 15, 1974, at the Sesquicentennial Celebration of Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University. This piece was presented to Thomas Jefferson University by the President of the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College, Dr. John J. Gartland. The composition was composed by Burle Marx.

THE PRESIDENTIAL BADGE OF THOMAS JEFFERSON UNIVERSITY

The President's Badge was created for the Inauguration of Lewis W. Bluemle, Jr., M.D., the third President of Thomas Jefferson University, on September 7, 1977. It consists of four official corporate seals of Thomas Jefferson University and the predecessor corporation, The Jefferson Medical College of Philadelphia. These seals were used to mark diplomas, certificates, and other official documents and have been gold-plated to form the Presidential Badge.

The medallion on the President's right is the corporate seal of Thomas Jefferson University today and was created in 1969 when Jefferson Medical College became Thomas Jefferson University. It carries a contemporary likeness of Thomas Jefferson.

The other three medallions are the various seals that were used in Jefferson Medical College for many years. The oldest marked every diploma that was issued by the College from 1839 to 1967. This seal carries a traditional likeness of a young Thomas Jefferson and the founding date of the College as 1826. Prior to 1839 the diploma of Jefferson Medical College carried the seal of the Jefferson College in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania—the parent institution.

Another seal was developed in 1967 as a result of research done by the late Edward L. Bauer, Emeritus Professor of Pediatrics, who determined that the founding year of Jefferson Medical College was 1824 rather than 1826. This seal is identical to the present corporate seal except the words "Thomas Jefferson University" replace "Jefferson Medical College". It was used for only two years—from 1967 to 1969.

The Presidential Badge is on permanent display in the Scott Library and is used at all convocations of the Juiversity.
