The following prizes were awarded:

The Dr. Francis W. Shain Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Physiology, to undergraduate William Eisenhardt, of Pennsylvania.

The Dr. Francis W. Shain Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Surgery, to Victor Wade Metzler, of Ohio.

The Dr. Francis W. Shain Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Practice of Medicine, to Archibald Hunter Graham, of Pennsylvania.

The Dr. Francis W. Shain Gold Medal for the best Examination in Practice of Medicine, to Albert Ralston Matheny, of Pennsylvania.

A Gold Medal, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to Obstetrics, to Thomas Snyder, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention to G. Totten McMaster, of Connecticut.

A Gold Medal, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to Pathology, to undergraduate Thomas Wesley Moran, of Pennsylvania.

A Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to undergraduate Scott W. Lau, of Pennsylvania.

A Case of Instruments, given by Prof. Montgomery, for the best Examination in Gynecology, to Thomas William Griffin, of Canada, with honorable mention of Victor Wade Metzler, of Ohio, and Archibald Hunter Graham, Jr., of Pennsylvania.

A Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Opthalmology, to Eugene R. Carpenter, of Missouri, with honorable mention to Rufus Thomas Dorsey, Jr., of Georgia, Saylor John McGhee, of Pennsylvania, and Albert Ralston Matheny, of Pennsylvania.

The J. C. Wilson Society Prize of Fifty Dollars, given by a friend of the Society, for the best Examination in Practice of Medicine on the part of a member of the J. C. Wilson Society, was divided between two competitors, each of

whom attained the standing of 100 per cent. Their names are Archibald Hunter Graham, Ir., of Pennsylvania, and Albert Ralston Matheny, of Pennsylvania.

The W. W. Keen Society Prize, given by P. Albert Moore, M.D., a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Surgery on the part of a member of the Keen Society, to James William McIntosh, of Canada.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination on the Physiological Action of Drugs, by "a friend of the higher medical education," to undergraduate Edwin Russell Kennedy, of Ohio.

The Alumni Prize of a Medal, for the best General Average of Scholarship gained in the entire curriculum, to Albert Ralston Matheny, of Pennsylvania.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of the Clinical Lectures on Diseases of Children by Prof. Graham, was divided between two competitors whose reports were of equal merit. Their names are Uriah Higinbotham McMullen, of Pennsylvania, and Victor Wade Metzler, of Pennsylvania.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best report of the Clinical Lectures on Diseases of the Nervous System by Prof. Dercum, to Eugene R. Carpenter, of Missouri.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of the Clinical Lectures on Obstetrics by Prof. Davis, to James Wm. MacIntosh, of Canada, with honorable mention to Victor Wade Metzler, of Pennsylvania.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of the Clinical Lectures on Ophthalmology by Prof. Hansell, to Charles Frederick English, of California.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of the Clinical Lectures on Otology, by Prof. S. MacCuen Smith, to Eugene R. Carpenter, of Missouri.

A Prize of Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Dermatology by Prof. Stelwagon, to Saylor John McGhee, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of Eugene R. Carpenter, of Missouri.

A Case of Instruments, given by Prof. Kyle, for the best Examination in Laryngology, to Pliny F. Stevens, of Maine.
