## **Library Collections**

#### **Journals**

Over 3,500 current full-text electronic journal subscriptions, as well as thousands of older or freely-available titles, are accessible to Jefferson users on JEFFLINE. Your Campus Key provides you with remote access to these titles. The Library also maintains an extensive collection of research literature in bound journal volumes located on the third floor. #### **Books**


The Library's scholarly collection of more than 85,100 books is located on the 4th floor. There is also a leisure-reading collection of popular fiction and non-fiction located on the 1st floor. Both collections are accessible for use by Jeffersonians 24 hours a day. In addition, the Jefferson community has access to a growing collection of over 1,375 electronic books. #### **University Archives and Special Collections**

These non-circulating collections are located in Room 401. The University Archives acquires and preserves important TJU records and departmental publications, faculty and student personal papers, memorabilia, photographs, and historical artifacts. The Special Collections include approximately 3,700 books recording the history of health sciences from the 16th century to the present.

The Daniel Baugh Institute of Anatomy (1911-1968) at Jefferson Medical College was located at 11th and Clinton Streets. The DBI housed an auditorium, dissection rooms, and a pathology museum. It commissioned hundreds of oversized pedagogical drawings, like these, for easy viewing in the large lecture hall. Artists who produced these works included talented post-graduates or non-Jefferson art students who copied from textbook images and cadavers.

## **Services**

#### **Information Services**

Information Services staff offer Jefferson faculty, staff, and students free personalized expert assistance in finding information and in using library resources. IS staff also provide help in identifying grant funding opportunities and in using bibliographic management software like RefWorks.

#### **Circulation Services**

Books may be checked out for three weeks and renewed for two 3-week intervals. Bound journals may be checked out for one day. The Reserve Collection, located behind the Service Desk on the 2nd floor, includes course-related books, documents, anatomical models and human bone collections. The Service Desk also loans macintosh laptops and iPads.

#### **Photocopying & Printing**

VendaCards are required for all Library photocopy machines and laser-printing services and can be purchased at the Circulation Desk. Staff-assisted color printing is available in the JAH Learning Resources Center.

#### Interlibrary Loan (ILL)/JEFFDocs Photocopy Service

ILL provides books and journal articles not owned by Scott Memorial Library. JEFFDocs Photocopy Service provides photocopies or desktop delivery of articles in the Library's journal collection. Fees and delivery methods for ILL and JEFFDocs services are the same.

# BrowZine Brings Scott Library Journals to Your iPad



Now you can create a personal bookshelf of your favorite Scott Library journals using BrowZine for iPad. Search journal collections by Subject or choose titles from the A-Z list. View journal tables of contents and use the button to add journals to your bookshelf.

You'll be able to:

- Easily read and save full-text scholarly journals in a format optimized for tablet devices
- · Be alerted when new issues of journals are published
- Save articles to RefWorks, Zotero, Mendeley, Dropbox & other services

### Scope

While the selection does not include every journal in our collection, titles from major journal publishers (including Elsevier, Springer, Wiley, Nature Group. JAMA and NJEM) are currently included. As new agreements are made with publishers, additional content will be added. Just be sure to register as a Jeffersonian to get access to SML-subscribed journals.

## **Technology Resources**

The Scott Memorial Library offers public access computers and iMac & PC computer classrooms for use by Jefferson students, staff and faculty. Computers



in classrooms are available for open use when the rooms are not reserved. There are two classrooms on the 3rd floor of the Library: one outfitted with PCs and one with iMacs.

The Learning Resources Center on the Mezzanine of

Jefferson Alumni Hall (JAH LRC) provides access to two 40-seat PC computer classrooms which can be combined into one 80-seat room. Equipment, software and support for digital video editing and image editing, videoconferencing, webcasting, faxing, and printing are also available in the JAH-LRC. An additional classroom on the 3rd floor of Jefferson Alumni Hall is equipped with 27 iMac computers.

Productivity and specialized software available on the public and classroom computers includes: Anatomy visualization, SAS/SPSS, GIS applications, and the Microsoft Office Suite. SPSS can also be accessed from any computer onor off-campus by those who have an active Jefferson campus key and password.

Wireless networking for mobile computing is available throughout the Library. Support for mobile computing on the library's 2nd floor includes: tables with large screen monitors, connection cables, wireless keyboards, chargers and floor and column power outlets.
