New Resources


EndNote -

EndNote is a citation management program that lets you import citations from numerous literature databases into one place. Save references from databases and websites, organize sources with tags and folders, and create in-text citations and bibliographies within Microsoft Word.



Nature Protocols -

Nature Protocols is an online publication that presents peer-to-peer protocols in biological and biomedical sciences. The resource offers step-by-step descriptions of procedures which you can take to the lab and immediately apply to your research.



Grants & Funding

Let Jefferson cover your Article Processing Charges (APC) with the **Open Access Publishing Fund!** This fund offers financial support to Jefferson faculty, students, and staff who wish to publish in Open Access journals. Jefferson will contribute up to \$2,500 per article. (See the application for complete details.) Since the fund began in October 2018, 17 articles have been supported and published in Open Access journals. Funds for the 2019-2020 Academic Year will be available in July. Pivot is a database that helps you find **global and local funding opportunities**.
