LONNIE EILEEN ALLEN

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE — COKIE ROBERTS

Cokie Roberts is a Correspondent for ABC News covering politics, Congress, and public policy. She is part of the weekly roundtable discussion on "This Week With David Brinkley" and often serves as a substitute anchor on "Nightline."

In addition to her work for ABC, Ms. Roberts serves as a news analyst for National Public Radio, where she was the Congressional correspondent for more than 10 years. In that time she won numerous awards, including the highest award in public radio, the Edward R. Murrow Award. She was also the first broadcast journalist to win the highly prestigious Everett McKinley Dirksen Award for coverage of Congress. In 1991, Ms. Roberts was named one of *Glamour* magazine's "Ten Outstanding Women of 1991," *M* magazine named her a "Powerbroker of 1991," and the National Mothers Day Committee honored her as "Outstanding Mother of the Year."

Her op-ed columns have appeared in the *New York Times* and the *Washington Post*. She has also written for the *New York Times Magazine* and *The Atlantic*.

Before joining ABC in 1988, Ms. Roberts was a contributor to PBS-TV's MacNeil/Lehrer Newshour. Her coverage of the Iran/Contra affair for that program won her the Weintal Award in 1987.

Prior to joining NPR, Ms. Roberts was a reporter for CBS News in Athens, Greece. She also produced and hosted a public affairs program on WRC-TV, Washington, D.C.

From 1981 to 1984, in addition to her work at NPR, she co-hosted "The Lawmakers," a weekly public television program on Congress. Ms. Roberts is former President of the Radio and Television Correspondents Association.

A 1964 graduate in political science from Wellesley College, Ms. Roberts received a 1985 Distinguished Alumnae Achievement Award "in recognition of excellence and distinction in professional pursuits."

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE — PROFESSOR FRITZ MELCHERS

Professor Fritz Melchers is the Director of the Basel Institute for Immunology and one of the world's fore-most immunologists.

He has achieved international recognition for his outstanding studies of the mechanism involved in the formation and function of B cell lymphocytes. B cell lymphocytes produce antibodies, which are one of the body's principal defenses against disease. Among his most important discoveries are genetic mechanisms that control the development of B cells, making the body ready to encounter antigens (bacteria or viruses). He and his colleagues discovered three genes (mb-1, V-pre-B, and $\lambda 5$) that are expressed only in pre-B stem cells (early B-lineage cells).

The discovery of these genes, which form the surrogate light-chain, led to experiments where such pre-B stem cells from auto-immune, disease-prone mice were transplanted into SCID mice. Their subsequent growth and the development of auto-immune disease showed that these cells would be suitable targets for gene therapy. These discoveries have important implications for our understanding of auto-immune disease and cancer.

Professor Melchers received his undergraduate degree in chemistry at the University of Cologne, Germany, in 1961. In 1964 he earned a Ph.D. from the same university and then worked as a research associate at the Salk Institute for Biological Studies in La Jolla, California. Later he studied as a post-doctoral fellow and senior assistant at the Max Planck Institute for Molecular Genetics in Berlin, Germany. Between 1970 and 1971 he was a visiting scientist at the Weizmann Institute in Israel and Stanford University in California. After receiving a second doctorate in 1971 from the University of Freiberg, Germany, he joined that university's Faculty of Biology, serving there until 1974.

In 1973 he was appointed to the Faculty of Biology at the University of Heidelberg and has served there as an honorary professor since 1978. Professor Melchers was on the faculty of the Wistar Institute in Philadelphia from 1980 until 1991 and has been a member of the Jefferson Cancer Institute since 1992. He is also currently a member of the Faculty of Natural Sciences at the University of Basel, Switzerland.

He joined the Basel Institute for Immunology as a Permanent Member in 1970 and was appointed Director in 1980, succeeding Nobel Prize laureate, the late Dr. Niels Jerne. The Basel Institute for Immunology, founded in 1968 and since supported by F. Hoffmann-La Roche, Ltd., is one of the leading research centers on immunological disease. It has recently produced two other Nobel Prize laureates in addition to Dr. Jerne—Dr. Susumo Tonegawa and Dr. Georges Köhler.

In addition to his eminence as a researcher, Professor Melchers is also a leader in the scholarship of his field. He is on the editorial boards of several international journals on immunology and has written scores of journal articles, books, and book chapters. He has also been active as a leader of the field's major scientific meetings and symposia. Among Professor Melchers' many honors are his memberships in Academia Europea and the Leopoldina, an honorary M.D. from University of Turku, Finland, and the Burroughs-Wellcome Visiting Professorship at the University of California in San Francisco.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE — DR. CHARLES MERIEUX

Dr. Charles Merieux is the founder and retired president of the Institut Merieux, the largest producer of vaccines in the world. He is a pioneer in the creation of several new vaccines and is widely honored for his success in mobilizing governmental and industrial groups to ensure the delivery of these vaccines whenever the need arose. Of particular note is his quick response to an outbreak of meningitis in Brazil. Dr. Merieux used the facilities of the Institut Merieux to develop and produce in large quantities meningococcal vaccine. He then went to Brazil and personally directed a campaign of vaccinating millions of children during an epidemic, thus preventing a wider outbreak.

Dr. Merieux earned two bachelor's degrees prior to entering medical school in Lyons. While in his last year of medical school, in 1937, he assumed responsibility for a laboratory that had been started in 1897 by his father, Marcel Merieux, who collaborated with Louis Pasteur.

His first great immunological success was in the development of a vaccine for hoof and mouth disease, which was rapidly spreading in Europe after World War II. In this effort he demonstrated his unusual talent for working with all the forces of industrial biology to perfect a vaccine whenever one was demanded by emerging circumstances. Dr. Merieux founded the French Institute of Hoof and Mouth Disease in 1947 as part of his response to the outbreak. This Institute soon facilitated the preparation of new vaccines against polio and led to the development of vaccines against German measles and rabies in 1965.

In 1955 he organized the first meeting on biological standardization to foster a climate of collaboration among researchers, manufacturers, and controllers of vaccines. He established the Marcel Merieux Foundation in 1967 to help carry on modern biological research and development in the spirit of Pasteur and to develop international activities in preventive medicine.

His great skills in developing vaccines is matched only by his ability to mobilize other leaders to work collaboratively to promote preventive medicine. He is known as a gentleman who is always respectful of other people's views. This enabled him to lead not only many successful prevention efforts, but also an extremely successful company.

In recognition for his great and unusual talents Dr. Merieux has received several honorary degrees throughout the world as well as several honors, including Grand Officer, Legion d'Honneur; Gold Medal of Health for All, the World Health Organization; Chevalier of the Order of George I of Greece; Commander, Brazilian Croix du Sud; Jubilee Awards in Science and Humanities, Weizmann Institute in Israel; and Commander of the National Order of Merit of France.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE — DEBHANOM MUANGMAN

Dr. Debhanom Muangman is a graduate of Jefferson Medical College who, since his return to Thailand, has become one of the most important leaders in public health in the Asia Pacific region. He is currently the Dean of the School of Environmental and Resource Studies at Mahidol University in Bangkok, and prior to that he was the Dean of the University's School of Public Health for 16 years. During that time he established several public health degree programs, and the school became the largest school of public health in Asia.

Dr. Muangman served as an advisor to many organizations, including the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the World Bank, the Thai Parliament, and the Thai Ministry of Public Health. He also served in a variety of leadership positions, including Chairman of the Health and Environmental Committee of Thailand, President of the International Public Health Association of Asia, and President of the Asia Pacific Academic Consortium for Public Health (APACPH). APACPH was formed in 1980 by Dr. Muangman in collaboration with four other deans of public health schools. Today it includes 31 universities throughout the Asia Pacific region.

Dr. Muangman came to Jefferson after receiving his bachelor's degree from Grinnell College. Upon graduating in 1962, he attended Harvard University, where he received a doctorate in public health. He also graduated from the United Nations' Development Institute and Thailand's National Defense College. In addition to his service as an academic and public leader, Dr. Muangman also has authored seven textbooks, served on many editorial boards, helped establish three scholarly journals, and written more than 200 articles in his field.

Dr. Muangman has used his leadership positions to raise awareness of a variety of public health concerns caused by political turmoil, economic development, and increased urbanization. He has mobilized educational and governmental forces to combat the spread of AIDS, deliver primary care to urban and rural poor, and improve health conditions in refugee camps. As Dean of the School of Environmental Resources and Studies, Dr. Muangman also conducted extensive environmental research addressing issues such as the misuse of agricultural chemicals and increased air pollution.

Among Dr. Muangman's many honors and prizes are the Medal for Outstanding International Public Health Worker from the University of Hawaii, the Outstanding Health Educator of Thailand Award, and the Professor Kazue McLaren Health Leadership Award from the Asia Pacific Academic Consortium for Public Health.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

The Thomas Jefferson University mace, carried for the first time in the 1986 commencement ceremonies by the grand marshal, was designed and cast by Howard Serlick, member of the Guild of Mastercraftsmen, Winterthur Scholar, and Chief Conservator (Gilding) of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. It was crafted by silversmith Eugene Zweigle and woodturner Michael Copeland.

The four-foot-long, fourteen-pound mace is made of ebony highlighted with lapis lazuli to reflect Jefferson's colors (black and blue). It features a miniature of Henry Mitchell's sculpture, The Winged Ox, symbol of Saint Luke the Physician, the original of which stands beside the Scott Building on Walnut Street. The miniature was cast in silver by Mister Zweigle, who also fabricated the University seal, the profile of Thomas Jefferson, mounted at the base of the staff. The J. E. Caldwell Company coordinated the project.

Mister Mitchell's original statue of The Winged Ox, adopted by the University in 1976 as its symbol of clinical excellence, is mounted on a column containing the names of fifty medical scientists who have most advanced the art of healing. It also reflects the historical evolution of Thomas Jefferson University from its beginnings as Jefferson Medical College in 1824 to its current status as an academic health center comprising the Medical College, the College of Allied Health Sciences, the College of Graduate Studies, and the Thomas Jefferson University Hospital.

The mace, a grand emblem of the University's heritage, is carried at the head of all formal academic processions.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The wearing of academic dress dates back to the early days of the oldest universities in the world. In the American Council on Education's book entitled *American Universities and Colleges*, it is suggested that "gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head..."

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress in 1895, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by almost all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the associates, bachelors, masters, and doctors and at the same time recognize the university which has given them the degree. Revisions to the code have occurred from time to time.

The associate's of arts and bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are worn closed. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cutaway, and is worn open or closed. The Doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn open or closed. Cotton poplin or similar material is used for the associate's, bachelor's, and master's degrees, and rayon- or silk-ribbed material is used for the doctor's degree. The majority of gowns are black, but a number of institutions have adopted other colors to identify special programs or groups within the institution.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the doctor's degree, 42 inches for the master's, and 36 inches for the bachelor's and associate's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the doctor's, master's, and bachelor's hoods are usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted. The associate of arts hood has no velvet border. The outside is black.

Black mortarboards are most commonly worn; six-sided tams of various colors may be used.

THE JEFFERSON PROCESSIONAL

The Jefferson Processional was commissioned by the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College and played for the first time on November 15, 1974, at the Sesquicentennial Celebration of Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University. This piece was presented to Thomas Jefferson University by the President of the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College, Doctor John J. Gartland. It was composed by Burle Marx.

THE PRESIDENTIAL BADGE OF THOMAS JEFFERSON UNIVERSITY

The President's Badge was created for the Inauguration of Lewis W. Bluemle, Jr., M.D., the third President of Thomas Jefferson University on September 7, 1977. It consists of four official corporate seals of Thomas Jefferson University and the predecessor corporation, The Jefferson Medical College of Philadelphia. These seals were used to mark diplomas, certificates, and other official documents and have been gold-plated to form the Presidential Badge.

The medallion on the President's right is the corporate seal of Thomas Jefferson University today and was created in 1969 when Jefferson Medical College became Thomas Jefferson University. It carries a contemporary likeness of Thomas Jefferson.

The other three medallions are the various seals that were used in Jefferson Medical College for many years. The oldest marked every diploma that was issued by the College from 1839 to 1967. This seal carries a traditional likeness of a young Thomas Jefferson and the founding date of the College as 1826. Prior to 1839 the diploma of Jefferson Medical College carried the seal of the Jefferson College in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania — the parent institution.

Another seal was developed in 1967 as a result of research done by the late Edward L. Bauer, Emeritus Professor of Pediatrics, who determined that the founding year of Jefferson Medical College was 1824 rather than 1826. This seal is identical to the present corporate seal except the words "Thomas Jefferson University" replace "Jefferson Medical College." It was used for only two years — from 1967 to 1969.

The Presidential Badge is on permanent display in the Scott Library and is used at all convocations of the University.
