The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to Jean George Bachmann, with honorable mention of Frank M. Sprague.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to George B. Foster, Jr., with honorable mention of William McDowell Johnston and Harry E. Diers.

Physiology Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the second year) to George William Brock.

Practice Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the Practice of Medicine, to Jean George Bachmann.

Therapeutic Prize. A Gold Medal for the best examination in Therapeutics, to Leonard E. Norris.

Surgery Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to Surgery, to Jacob John Kocher.

Obstetrical Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Leonard E. Norris, with honorable mention of Jacob John Kocher and George H. Clapp.

Chemical Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in the Chemical Laboratory (open for undergraduates), to Chester Augustus Billetdoux.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Anatomical Preparation (open to undergraduates), to Carl G. Brown.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Essay embodying original research on some subject connected with Pathology, to George B. Foster, Jr.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, Gold Medal for the best examination in Gynecology, to Charles Turner Sands, with honorable mention of Edgar B. Sloterbeck.

The W. S. Forbes Anatomical League Prize of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, given by the Estate of Professor Wm. S. Forbes, to the member of the Anatomical League having the highest standing in a competitive examination in Anatomy, to Max Meitzner, with honorable mention of Edgar B. Sloterbeck, Frank M. Sprague and James J. Hoban.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Neurology, to Charles Turner Sands, with honorable mention of Jacob John Kocher and Benjamin P. Weiss.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Wilburn H. Smith, with honorable mention of Max Meitzner.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Graham, Twenty-five Dollars for the best report on his Clinics, to Sidney Lessing Olsho, with honorable mention of Jean George Bachmann.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Horwitz, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Charles Turner Sands.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best examination in Ophthalmology, to Edward J. Sweeney.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Sidney L. Olsho, with honorable mention of John H. Johnson and Edgar B. Sloterbeck.

Laryngology Prize. By Professor Kyle, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Original Essay on a subject pertaining to Laryngology and Rhinology, to Boaz B. Cox, with honorable mention of Edward J. Sweeney.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a medal, for the best general average gained in the Examination for the entire Curriculum, to Jean George Bachmann.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Twenty-three Volumes complete of Saunders' Medical Hand Atlases, to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior year, to Jacob John Kocher.
