New Resources



There's a new tool for immunology research – **FlowJo!** FlowJo helps with viewing and analyzing flow cytometric data. FlowJo creates publication-worthy graphics, models for advanced data analysis, and more. <u>Create a new FlowJo account</u> from the Jefferson Libraries website. If your lab has

an existing FlowJo account, continue to use that account until it expires, and request a Jefferson account when your license is close to expiring. <u>Learn more about FlowJo and get started now.</u>

Citation Tools

If you use the Legacy version of **RefWorks** (orange interface), update your account to the current version (blue interface) by June 30, 2023. Statistical Tools

SAS is software for statistical analysis, operations research and project management, application development, data warehousing, and more. Download the <u>latest version of SAS</u> and learn <u>what's new in version 9.4</u>.

Grants & Funding






Open access publishing at Jefferson has never been more exciting! Jefferson Libraries entered into institutional open access agreements with ACS (American Chemical Society) and Wiley, two major scholarly publishers. Article Processing Charges (APC) are now waived for authors publishing in these journals.

Formally known as Transformative Agreements, these new licenses provide unlimited electronic access to all Wiley, Hindawi, and ACS journals, along with no-fee open access publishing for Jefferson authors. Jefferson Libraries will pay these publishers an additional annual license fee to participate in these Agreements.




Publishing & Communication
