The following prizes were awarded:

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to Evans Dounton Russell.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Thomas Aloysius Shallow.

Physiology Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the second year), to Frederick Rice Lummis, with honorable mention of Cleon Woodward Colby.

Practice Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to John Henry Burkartmaier.

Therapeutic Prize. A Gold Medal for the best examination in Therapeutics, to Peter Cope White, with honorable mention of William A. Shaw and Penrose H. Shelley.

Obstetrical Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to William Alger Shaw.

Surgery Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to James Hale Paul.

Chemical Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in the Chemical Laboratory (open to undergraduates), to Fred. August Thysell.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Anatomical Preparation (open to undergraduates), to Karl Dean Figley, with honorable mention of David M. Dry and Frederick R. Lummis.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for the best examination in the Department of Pathology to Erwin Deaterly Funk.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, Gold Medal for the best clinical report on Gynecology, to Garrett Lee Hynson, with honorable mention of Lorne E. Hastings and Augustus E. Smith.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Edgar Lentz Sowden, with honorable mention of Austin Hoffman Coleman.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Garrett Lee Hynson, with honorable mention of Charles George Boyer.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Graham, Twenty-five Dollars for the best report on his Clinics, to James Joseph Walsh, with honorable mention of Lorne E. Hastings, Morris I. Moss, Garrett L. Hynson and George C. Warnock.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Horwitz, Gold Medal for the best examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Garrett Lee Hynson.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best examination in Ophthalmology, to Evans D. Russell, with honorable mention of Thomas A. Shallow.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Asa Bartholow Carmichael, with honorable mention of Charles Edward Feddeman and Herbert Charles Oelschlegel.

Laryngology Prize. By Professor Kyle, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Original Essay on a subject pertaining to Laryngology and Rhinology, to Rufus Hansom Hagood, Jr.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a medal for the best general average gained in the Examination for the entire Curriculum, to Thomas Aloysius Shallow.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Twenty-three Volumes complete of Saunders' Medical Hand Atlases, to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior year, to Thomas Aloysius Shallow.

Out-Patient Obstetric Prize. By Dr. W. H. Wells, Associate in Clinical Obstetrics, a case of Instruments, for the best Report of Work in Out-Patient Maternity Service, to George Louis Schneider.

The Spitzka Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Spitzka to the member of the League presenting the best original contribution to the science of anatomy, including embryology and histology, to Horace G. Dunham, with honorable mention of Walter R. Krauss.
