Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Kenneth Jastram Holtz, with honorable mention of William V. Fulton and Leon Solis-Cohen.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Scott S. Russell, with honorable mention of Benjamin Brown and Herbert Roy Van Ness.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Ralph McKay Lytle, with honorable mention of Roscoe F. Mauser and Arthur A. Brindley.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a medal for the best general average gained in the examination for the entire Curriculum, to Thomas Francis Mullen.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Twenty-three Volumes complete of Saunders' Medical Hand Atlases, to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior year, to Henry Keller Mohler.

Out-Patient Obstetric Prize. By Dr. W. H. Wells, Associate in Clinical Obstetrics, a case of Instruments, for the best Report of Work in Out-Patient Maternity Service, to Joseph Cummings Poffenberger.
