Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the second year), to Edward Weiss.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to Mitchell Porter Stiles, with honorable mention of Asa Margrave Lehman and Charles Allen Pryor.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal for the best examination in Therapeutics, to Victor K. Marsteller, with honorable mention of John Lee Hydrick and Joseph Turner.

Obstetrics Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Harold Stern Davidson, with honorable mention of Joseph Francis Dolphin.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to Samuel Orr Black.

Chemistry Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in the Chemical Laboratory (open to undergraduates), to Julian Erdreich Meyer, with honorable mention of W. Edgar Christie and Oram Roscoe Kline.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Albert Norman Redelin, with honorable mention of Julian Erdreich Meyer and Raymond J. Bower.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Examination in the Department of Pathology, to Harold Stern Davidson.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, a Gold Medal for the best Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Harry French Hoyle.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Joseph Aspel, with honorable mention of Samuel Blaugrund and Harold Wade Kinderman.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Harold Stern Davidson, with honorable mention of John A. Connelly and John Lee Hydrick.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Samuel Orr Black.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five dollars for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to Mitchell Porter Stiles, with honorable mention of Chester Lawrence Lassiter, John Bloss Wollfe and William David Baun.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Harold Stern Davidson, with honorable mention of Harold Wade Kinderman, John Lee Hydrick and Paul B. Bender.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the examination for the entire curriculum, to John Lee Hydrick.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Twenty-three volumes complete, of Saunders' Medical Hand Atlases, to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior year, to John Lee Hydrick.

Out-Patient Obstetric Prize. By Professor W. H. Wells, a Case of Instruments for the best Report of Work in Out-Patient Maternity Service, to Walter George Goodman.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology and Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Albert Norman Redelin, with honorable mention of Harry Ward Croop and J. Malcolm Weber.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Junior year, to Ulrich Peter Horger.
