The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery, to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Walter Thomas Annon.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the second year), to Thaddeus Lemert Montgomery, with honorable mention of Vaughn Clifton Garner.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to Furman Angel, with honorable mention of Denis Roscoe Wolff and Clifford John Wickert.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to Henry Kajetan Seelaus, with honorable mention of Charles Preston Mangum and James Henry Mason, 3d.

Obstetrics Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Ray Washington Hayworth, with honorable mention of Walter Thomas Annon and Stanley Quay West.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain. for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to William Maurice Coppridge.

Chemistry Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in Physiological Chemistry (open to undergraduates), to Willard Snow Sargent, with honorable mention of Thaddeus Lemert Montgomery and Ellwood Carl Weise.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Willard Snow Sargent, with honorable mention of Lawrence Goldbacher, William Alexander Wallace and Thaddeus Lemert Montgomery.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for general excellence in the Department of Pathology to Henry Kajetan Seelaus.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Denis Roscoe Wolff, with honorable mention of Walter Thomas Annon.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Henry Kajetan Seelaus, with honorable mention of James Harold Mendel.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Harry Ernest Heinitsh, Jr., with honorable mention of Florentine B. Jones, Jr., and Chin Wen Low.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Henry Kajetan Seelaus, with honorable mention of Robert Sylvester Milligan.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five dollars for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to Howard Johnson Combs, with honorable mention of Walter Gray Klugh.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Charles Preston Mangum, with honorable mention of John Bryan Fullmer.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the examination for the entire curriculum, to Henry Kajetan Seelaus.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Seventy-five dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Henry Kajetan Seelaus.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology and Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Thaddeus Lemert Montgomery, with honorable mention of William Herbert Summers.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Junior year, to Edmund Lloyd Jones.

The Hawk Biochemical Society Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Hawk to the member of the Society presenting the best paper upon some designated chemical phase of clinical medicine, to Edmund Lloyd Jones, with honorable mention of Francis Coward Hartung.
