PRIZES

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine, to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to Paul Risley Adams, with honorable mention of Edward J. Halloran and Bruce L. Fleming.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery, to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Bernard Herman Smith, with honorable mention of Earl Blan Ross.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to Lewis Maxwell Lide, with honorable mention of Orman Gregersen and Benjamin Mortimer Stout.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to Frank Hammond Krusen, with honorable mention of Foster Leonard Dennis, Paul Pelley Warden and Livingston S. Hinckley.

Obstetrics Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Bruce L. Fleming, with honorable mention of Henry Lewis Hansell.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to William Earl McCullough.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in the Department of Pathology to Bruce L. Fleming, with honorable mention of David Ross Kennedy.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Walter Standlee Love, with honorable mention of Roscoe van der Bie.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Earl Blan Ross, with honorable mention of Lawrence Gustavus Heins.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Doff D. Daniel, with honorable mention of Stuart Ward Vanderbeek and William Burr Atkinson.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to Earl Blan Ross, with honorable mention of Ernest Lawrence Perri.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Franklin Calton Smith, with honorable mention of Francis Edward Proctor and Foster Leonard Dennis.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the Examinations for the entire curriculum, to Earl Blan Ross.

W. B. Saunders' Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Earl Blan Ross.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded in memory of Francis Torrens Stewart for general excellence in Clinical Surgery, to Earl Blan Ross.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to Harvey Rosenberger Bauman.

Chemistry Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in Physiological Chemistry (open to undergraduates), to Kenneth Griffith Whyte, with honorable mention of David Metheny.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Kenneth Griffith Whyte, with honorable mention of William Eugene Delaney, Jr., Samuel Tobias Gordy and Frank Serafino.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology and Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Eugene Wilfred Beauchamp, with honorable mention of Philip E. Ayer and Alexander Miller Hursh.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Junior Year, to Samuel Dale Spotts.

The Hawk Biochemical Society Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Hawk to the member of the Society presenting the best paper upon some designated chemical phase of clinical medicine, to Chesterfield James Holley, with honorable mention of Francis T. O'Donnell.
