## President's Award — Harold and Lynne Honickman

Harold Honickman is chairman of the Honickman Group, a soft drink bottling and distribution company. Harold began his career in 1957 with the purchase of a 300,000-case Pepsi plant in Pennsauken, New Jersey. He gradually acquired unbeneficial bottling operations, made them whole and made them profitable. The combined soft drink businesses have grown to be one of the largest privately owned bottling and distribution operations in the United States, with companies located from New York to Virginia.

In the mid-1980s the Honickman family became involved in the beer distribution business in New York. Shortly thereafter, they acquired interests in beer companies located in Pennsylvania and southern New Jersey. In recent years, they have expanded through the acquisition of interests in Arizona, New Hampshire and Boston. The affiliated companies are together one of the largest beer distribution networks in the United States.



Involved in many community organizations, Harold is vice president of the Board of Trustees of the Kimmel Center and a member of its Executive, Development and Nominating Governance Committees. He also serves on the Board of Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, as well as the boards of the Perkins Library at Duke University, the Fund for the School District of Philadelphia, and Cutting Edge Beverages. In addition, Harold is a member of Project HOME's Investment Committee and an advisory board member of The Honickman Foundation.

Harold is a graduate of the Pennsylvania Military Academy (now known as Widener University), where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree.

Lynne Korman Honickman, a devoted wife and partner for more than 60 years, has managed to bring into balance the life of being a supportive spouse, with her passions, interests and values. Formally trained as a writer and artist, Lynne is now an activist for the arts and for pressing social issues. Her core values are derived from her family and her Jewish heritage – a legacy that values hard work, family and civic responsibility.

In 1989, Lynne established The Honickman Foundation which is dedicated to supporting projects that promote the arts, education, health, social change and heritage. The Foundation has established two national book prizes, one in poetry with the *American Poetry Review* (APR) and one in photography with the Center for Documentary Studies at Duke University.


Lynne is a trustee of the Philadelphia Museum of Art and a member of its Architectural and Facilities Committee, as well as the committees on Education, Executive and Prints, Drawings and Photographs. She is also a member of the PMA Friends Group, Focus: Friends of Photography. In addition, Lynne serves on the board and development committee of Project HOME and the board of CeaseFirePA. She is on the advisory boards of the Jefferson-Myrna Brind Center of Integrative Medicine, the Support Center for Child Advocates, MANNA (Metropolitan Area Neighborhood Nutrition Alliance), the APR, and the Governor's Advisory Board for Education and Labor.

The Honickman's two children are now four by marriage: Marjorie and Jeffrey Honickman and Shirley and Richard Hahn. They have four grandchildren, Sara and Mauri Honickman, and Julia and Henry Hahn.

## Doctor of Science — Caroline and Sidney Kimmel

Sidney Kimmel was born and raised in Philadelphia, and the philanthropic footprint he has created here evidences an unparalleled devotion to his hometown. From his very humble roots, first in South then West Philadelphia, Mr. Kimmel went on to found the Jones Apparel Group, developing it into a New York Stock Exchange company and one of the world's leading designers and marketers of branded apparel, footwear and accessories.

Mr. Kimmel's first job in the garment industry was as an inventory clerk and later a traveling salesman for a women's wear manufacturer. From there, he joined the iconic clothing company, Villager, rising through the ranks to become its president and CEO. In 1970, Mr. Kimmel established his own clothing line, Jones New York, and during the '70s and '80s became one of the major players in the women's apparel industry. Jones went public in 1991, adding many notable brands to its line, including



Anne Klein, Nine West, Gloria Vanderbilt and Stuart Weitzman, among others. Mr. Kimmel served as CEO until 2003 and as Chairman until 2014 when The Jones Group was sold for \$2.2 billion.

Sidney and Caroline Kimmel were married in 1999, and reside in Southern California just miles from where Caroline was raised. Together, they have continued the many philanthropic endeavors to which Mr. Kimmel committed after taking Jones public.

As early as 2002, *Business Week* recognized that Mr. Kimmel had donated more than half of his fortune to philanthropic works and had committed to giving the balance of his estate to further those efforts, a distinction that put him among a very select group of the nation's wealthiest. In 2010, he readily signed the Giving Pledge, the Warren Buffett and Bill Gates initiative encouraging America's billionaires to contribute half of their wealth to charitable endeavors. Mr. Kimmel was elected to the American Academy of Arts & Sciences in 2017 in recognition of his business, corporate and philanthropic leadership.

Of the \$850 million-plus the Kimmels have donated, more than \$550 million has gone to fund cancer research. In 1997, Mr. Kimmel established the Kimmel Scholars Program to fund young, innovative cancer scientists with their earliest grants to stimulate their research and advance their careers. With just under 300 award recipients, the Program has launched the next generation of the nation's leading cancer researchers. Major gifts also subsidized cancer research and care at the Sidney Kimmel Comprehensive Cancer Center at Johns Hopkins, the Sidney Kimmel Center for Prostate and Urologic Cancers at Memorial Sloan Kettering, research programs championed by the Stand Up To Cancer effort, and much more.

Substantial gifts have also been made to organizations promoting the arts, education, health sciences and Jewish continuity. In Philadelphia, his philanthropic leadership established the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, and he provided endowment gifts to the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia and the Raymond and Ruth Perelman Jewish Day School. The Sidney Kimmel Theater in the National Constitution Center is named in his honor, and he is also lead donor to the National Museum of American Jewish History.

Mr. Kimmel has been an extremely generous benefactor to Jefferson, providing cornerstone funding to establish the Sidney Kimmel Cancer Center in 1995 as well as transformational support for research into the prevention of cardiovascular disease. The most recent forward-thinking gift – the largest in Jefferson's history – to name the Sidney Kimmel Medical College demonstrates the Kimmels' appreciation of Jefferson's nearly 200 years of medical excellence and their confidence in Jefferson's path-breaking leadership in the future of healthcare.

Recognizing the fundamental importance of medical education and the impact of additional philanthropy, a significant portion of this landmark gift was set aside to establish the Kimmel Matching Program. This unique opportunity will provide a match for donors who establish new endowed scholarships and professorships. The Kimmel Matching Program already has inspired other philanthropists to give generously in support of medical education. To date, the Kimmel Match has leveraged almost \$3.5 million in more than 20 new endowed scholarships and \$6 million in new professorships. In addition, the Caroline Kimmel Endowed Fund for Scholarships has, in just its first two years, enabled Sidney Kimmel Medical College to award scholarships and attract outstanding students it might not have otherwise.

## Doctor of Science - Donato J. Tramuto, MBA

Donato J. Tramuto, MBA is the CEO of Tivity Health, Inc., a leading provider of network development and management solutions in healthcare. A recognized innovator and industry leader, Tramuto has more than 35 years of healthcare experience, with a deep commitment to global healthcare access, a steadfast focus on patient outcomes, and a keen understanding of digital solutions. He joined Tivity Health's board in 2013 and became chairman in 2014 and CEO in 2015.

In less than a year after being named Tivity CEO, Tramuto executed a turnaround of the company's performance by harnessing the lessons he learned through various adversities and "bulldozer" moments, and engineered a creative sale of one of the company's non-performing divisions, adding nearly \$1 billion of valuation to the company. In 2008, Tramuto founded Physicians Interactive Holdings (now known as Aptus Health),



a global provider of insight-driven digital engagement solutions for healthcare professionals and consumers. There he served as CEO and chairman prior to joining Tivity Health, Inc.

In 2011, he founded Health eVillages, a non-profit organization which provides state-of-the-art mobile health technology in the most challenging clinical environments. He is also the chairman and founder of the Tramuto Foundation, which helps individuals and organizations achieve their educational and healthcare goals.

Widely recognized for his three decades of commitment to social change, Tramuto was honored in 2014, alongside Hillary Clinton, Robert DeNiro and Tony Bennett, with the prestigious Robert F. Kennedy Ripple of Hope Award. In 2015, he received an honorary doctorate of humane letters from the College of Fine Arts at the University of Massachusetts, Lowell.

Tramuto is the chairman and founder of the Tramuto Foundation which helps individuals and organizations achieve their educational and healthcare goals. He serves on several executive leadership boards, including the board of the Boston University School of Public Health, the Livongo Health Foundation, the Brown University Healthcare Leadership Board, the board of directors for Sharecare, Inc., and the board of Safe Harbor Compliance and Clinical Development. In 2016, Tramuto was appointed to the board of Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights. He is also chairman of the board of Robert F. Kennedy Center for Justice & Human Rights Europe.

Tramuto is also the author of Life's Bulldozer Moments: How Adversity Leads to Success in Life and Business, a Hamilton Press publication.

### The University Mace

Originally a medieval weapon, the mace evolved from a short staff weighted with metal (used for breaking armor) into a bejeweled and sculptural relic. In one of the earliest ceremonial uses of the mace, it was carried by the royal bodyguard before the French king in the 1200s. It fell into disuse by the 16th century as firearms made protective armor and some hand-to-hand combat weapons obsolete. Examples of the mace as a symbol of authority in modern government include its use in the British House of Commons where the ceremonial mace has a presence on the Treasury table, and in the U.S. House of Representatives, where it is placed on a pedestal to the right of the Speaker's podium when the House is convened. Universities also used the ceremonial mace, borne by the chief marshal, during academic processions.

The Thomas Jefferson University Mace, carried for the first time in the 1986 commencement ceremonies by Grand Marshal Robert Mandle, Ph.D., was designed and cast by Howard Serlick, member of the Guild of Mastercraftsmen, Winterthur Scholar and Chief Conservator (Gilding) of the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. It was crafted by silversmith Eugene Zweigle and woodturner Michael Copeland.

The four-foot-long, 14-pound mace is made of ebony highlighted with lapis lazuli to reflect Jefferson's colors (black and blue). It features a miniature of Henry Mitchell's sculpture, the "Winged Ox of Saint Luke," symbol of Saint Luke the Physician, the original of which stands on campus beside the Scott Building on Walnut Street. The miniature was cast in silver by Zweigle.

Mitchell's original statue of the "Winged Ox," adopted by the University in 1976 as its symbol of clinical excellence, is mounted on a column containing the names of 50 medical scientists who have most advanced the art of healing. It also reflects the historical evolution of Thomas Jefferson University from its beginnings as Jefferson Medical College in 1824 to its current status as an academic institution comprising the Sidney Kimmel Medical College, the Jefferson College of Biomedical Sciences, the Jefferson College of Health Professions, the Jefferson College of Nursing, the Jefferson College of Pharmacy and the Jefferson College of Population Health.

The mace, a grand emblem of the University's heritage, is carried at the head of all formal academic processions.

## **Presidential Medallion of Thomas Jefferson University**

The President's Medallion was created in 2009 during the tenure of Robert L. Barchi, M.D., Ph.D., the fourth President of Thomas Jefferson University. It replaced the previous, well-worn President's Medallion made in 1977, which had depicted four old corporate seals used in various eras of the institution's history.

The current medallion was designed and crafted by Tiffany & Company, New York. It consists of a sterling silver medallion suspended from a heavy, silver double-link chain. The medallion's obverse depicts the University seal, a bas-relief profile of Thomas Jefferson, and the surround reads, "THOMAS JEFFERSON UNIVERSITY — 1824," the year the institution was founded. The reverse is engraved with the names of the four University Presidents.

Silver is a metal long-associated with medicine and is recognized to have antibacterial properties. Hippocrates (ca. 300 BCE) acknowledged the healing powers of silver and the ancients used silver bottles to keep water or wine from spoiling. The expression "born with a silver spoon in your mouth" comes from the Middle Ages when the wealthy gave their children silver spoons to suck on to prevent disease.

Like many academic traditions, the display of a heavy "chain of office" comes down to us from medieval regalia and represents the weight of responsibility for the wearer. The chain itself connotes strength in unity, as well as strong communication.

The Presidential Medallion is worn by the President at all convocations of the University.

#### The Jefferson Processional

The Jefferson Processional was commissioned by the Alumni Association of Jefferson Medical College, now named Sidney Kimmel Medical College, and played for the first time on November 15, 1974, at the Sesquicentennial Celebration of the Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University. This piece was presented to Thomas Jefferson University by the President of the Alumni Association, John J. Gartland, M.D. It was composed by Burle Marx.

## Academic Regalia

The attire worn at academic ceremonies evolved from the dress worn by clergy in the 12th and 13th centuries. In 1222, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Stephen Langston, decreed that a closed, flowing gown known as the cappa clausa be worn by all clerics within his jurisdiction. Because Oxford and Cambridge were within the provinces of Canterbury, the clerks at both institutions adopted this style of attire. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap.

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities, on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress in 1895, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by practically all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the associate's, bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees and, at the same time, recognize the university which has conferred the degree.

The associate in arts and bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are worn closed. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away, and is worn open or closed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn open or closed. The majority of gowns are black, but a number of institutions have adopted other colors to identify special programs or groups within that institution.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the doctoral degree, 42 inches for the master's and 36 inches for the bachelor's and associate's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the doctoral, master's and bachelor's hoods is usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted. The associate's hood does not have a velvet border. The outside is black.

Black mortarboards are most commonly worn; four-sided and six-sided tams of various colors are also used. Some of the colors in the bindings of the hoods are:
