PRIZES

The following prizes were awarded by the Dean, Ross V. Patterson, M.D.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine, to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of John Frank Coppolino and Min Hin Li.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery, to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Samuel Dale Spotts.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to Grover Andrew Meikle, with honorable mention of Herman Sigmund Zeve and Harry Havelock Etter.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to Andrew Purefoy Newcomb, Jr., with honorable mention of Grover Andrew Meikle.

Obstetrics Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Claude Aubra Latham, with honorable mention of James Meredith Ketchie and Donald Monroe Pfost.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to John Thompson Farrell, Jr.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in the Department of Pathology to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of Austin Thomas Smith.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Anspach, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of John Frank Coppolino and Harry Havelock Etter.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Paul Edmund Lavelle, with honorable mention of Michael Penta.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of Donald John McCormick.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to George Gordon, with honorable mention of Claude Aubra Latham and George Newcomer Riffle.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Austin Thomas Smith, with honorable mention of Min Hin Li.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Graham, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Pediatrics, to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of Uri Alonzo Carpenter and Heyward James Blackmon.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the Examinations for the entire curriculum, to Samuel Dale Spotts, with honorable mention of Austin Thomas Smith.

W. B. Saunders' Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Samuel Dale Spotts.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded in memory of Francis Torrens Stewart for general excellence in Clinical Surgery, to Austin Thomas Smith.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to Isidor Thomas Strittmatter, with honorable mention of Abraham Cantarow and Aaron Capper,

Chemistry Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in Physiological Chemistry (open to undergraduates), to Irving Range, with honorable mention of Henry Meyer Weber.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Aaron Capper, with honorable mention of Abraham Cantarow.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology and Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Lester Bowman McDonald, with honorable mention of Walter King Stewart and Dean Hart Le Favor.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Junior Year, to Abraham Lincoln Sherk.

The Hawk Biochemical Society Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Hawk to the member of the Society presenting the best paper upon some designated chemical phase of clinical medicine, to Eugene Wilfrid Beauchamp, with honorable mention of Edward B. Pedlow.
