Referencing Thomas Jefferson University in Manuscripts

As a quick reminder, when you are writing about Thomas Jefferson University in scholarly work, the University's branding style is to use "Thomas Jefferson University" for the first reference and "Jefferson" thereafter. Do not use "TJU," "Jefferson University," "Jeff," etc. Check out the Brand Central tab on MyJeffHub for answers to other questions about the Jefferson brand.
