Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on the subject pertaining to Surgery, to Francis Creveling Lutz.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal for General Excellence in the Department of Pathology to Kenneth Griffith Whyte, with honorable mention of David Metheny.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Anspach, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Thomas Rogers Hoge, with honorable mention of George Jacob Willauer and Horace Gledhill.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Charles Reed Gennaria, with honorable mention of Elliott Marion Mendenhall and Thomas Vincent Gocke.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Brinton Alfred Tilghman, with honorable mention of George Jacob Willauer and Philip Edward Ayer.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to Frank Justin Serafin, with honorable mention of Horace Gledhill and Ernest Langsdorff Noone.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Edward Patrick Ward, with honorable mention of George Roberts Hetrich.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Graham, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Pediatrics, to Philip Edward Ayer, with honorable mention of Charles Bernard Herman and Adolph Finn.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the Examinations for the entire curriculum, to William Eugene Delaney, Jr., with honorable mention of Kenneth Griffith Whyte, Philip Edward Ayer and Eugene Wilfrid Beauchamp.

W. B. Saunders' Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Charles Bernard Herman, with honorable mention of Eugene Wilfrid Beauchamp.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded in memory of Francis Torrens Stewart for general excellence in Clinical Surgery, to Eugene Wilfrid Beauchamp. Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to Leslie McLaughlin Nunn.

Chemistry Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Original Work in Physiological Chemistry (open to undergraduates), to Isadore Paul Slonimsky, with honorable mention of Nathaniel Hurwitz.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Alfred H. Diebel, with honorable mention of Nathaniel Hurwitz, Vincent Anthony Andriole and Jerry Baba Pearah.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology and Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Eugene H. Stillman, with honorable mention of Park Berkheimer.
