Jefferson Kimmel Cancer Center Support Groups

The Kimmel Cancer Center has a range of education and support programs to help patients and families throughout the cancer experience. Oncology Social Workers are also available to meet with cancer patients and their families to help with the psychosocial impact of a cancer diagnosis.

Current Topics in Cancer

A lecture series relevant to all cancer diagnoses related to cancer detection, treatment, and general health and wellness. Topics this fall include nutrition, financial concerns and stress management.

Facing Breast Cancer with Information and Support

An informational and supportive seminar for women with breast cancer.

Man-to-Man

An educational seminar for men diagnosed with prostate cancer co-sponsored by the American Cancer Society.

Talking to Your Children and Grandchildren About Cancer

A one-time program designed to provide information and support on discussing cancer with the children in your life. This program is open to adults with a cancer diagnosis and/or their caregivers and loved ones.

Look Good...Feel Better

A workshop for women with cancer to learn more about caring for themselves during treatment. This program will provide tips on skin care, wig styling, scarf tying and make-up tips. It is co-sponsored by the American Cancer Society.

Navigating the New Normal

An educational and support program for young adults between the ages of 18 and 45 who are living with cancer or have a history of cancer.

Coffee and Conversation

This group will be held in a casual atmosphere and will give young adults a place to discuss various cancer-related topics including treatment side effects, relationships, employment, etc. It will be led by a licensed social worker.

Back in the Saddle

This program is designed to address the many issues that arise during the completion of treatment, including the fear of recurrence, letting go of the treatment team and transitioning

back into normal life. This group will be lead by oncology social workers and will include a presentation by a cancer survivor.
