REMINDERS

Co-Authorship and OA Fees: Do Your Homework!

Fee-free open access publishing is sometimes available via read-write and transformative agreements between academic-research institutions and publishers, e.g., Jefferson's

agreement with Wiley (see link below). These agreements are triggered by the institutional affiliation of the CORRESPONDING author. Each academic-research institution has access to different agreements, so multi-institution author groups should investigate publishing agreements available to them through their various institutional affiliations. Consider factoring such agreements in when you choose the corresponding author—and perhaps even the journal—for your manuscript submission.
