The following prizes were awarded by the Dean, Ross V. Patterson, M.D.:

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine, to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to Yen Pui Chang, with honorable mention of Alfonso Ricardo Riddle, John Winthrop Gahan and Fay Merrill Whitsell.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery, to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Fay Merrill Whitsell, with honorable mention of Anthony E. Narducci.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to William Augustus Robert Stecher, with honorable mention of William Abraham Zavod and Marshall Kerry.

Therapeutics Prize. By Professor Hare, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to Alberto Oreamuno-Flores, with honorable mention of Mario Alberto Castallo.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to Surgery, to Anthony E. Narducci, with honorable mention of Francis Grove Miller.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Anspach, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Samuel Linn Grossman, with honorable mention of William Augustus Robert Stecher.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Strecker, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Herman Kleinman, with honorable mention of James Leonard Hollywood and Earl Clinton Romesberg.

Dr. A. Rusling Rainear Prize. Twenty-five Dollars awarded to that student of the Graduating Class who submits the most satisfactory essay upon a subject or question pertaining to Electro-therapeutics appended to the final examination questions, but not constituting a part of the examination, to Earl Clinton Romesberg, with honorable mention of Eugene Michael Kelley.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Loux, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Samuel Melvin Hauck, with honorable mention of Alfonso Ricardo Riddle.

Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Yen Pui Chang, with honorable mention of John Brogan Jordan, Jr.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Bauer, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Pediatrics, to Charles Oliver Metz, with honorable mention of Donald Luther Kegaries.

Obstetrics Prize. By Professor Bland, a Gold Medal for the best examination in Obstetrics, to John Winthrop Gahan.

Opthalmology Prize. By Professor Shannon, Electric Opthalmoscope for the best Examination in Opthalmology, to John Winthrop Gahan, with honorable mention of Patrick Samuel Pasquariello and Isador Ira Pollock.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor Rugh, Twenty-five Dollars to the member of the Senior Class presenting the best report of the clinics in Orthopedic Surgery, to Yen Pui Chang, with honorable mention of Donald Luther Kegaries. Laryngology Prize. By Professor Lewis, Twenty-five Dollars for general excellence in Laryngology, to Mario Alberto Castallo.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded for general excellence in Clinical Surgery in Memory of Francis Torrens Stewart, Professor of Clinical Surgery, Jefferson Medical College, 1910-1920, to Herman Kleinman, with honorable mention of Charles Oliver Metz.

W. B. Saunders' Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Yen Pui Chang.

William Potter Memorial Prize. Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars offered to encourage excellence in the clinical branches of medicine, and awarded to that graduate attaining the highest general average in the final two years of the medical course, to Yen Pui Chang.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the Examinations for the entire curriculum, to Yen Pui Chang.

Reserve Officers' Training Corps Prize. By the Surgeon-General, United States Army. Awarded to the student attaining the highest standing in the four-years' course in Military Science and Tactics, to Samuel Melvin Hauck.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to Kenneth Evans Fry.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to Maurice Daniel Krauss, with honorable mention of George Paul Moser.

The Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal given by Professor Schaeffer to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology, Histology and Comparative Anatomy, to George Paul Moser, with honorable mention of Thomas Kessinger Rathmell.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best general examination at the end of the Junior Year, to Charles Leith Munson.
