Open Researcher and Contributor iD



"ORCID provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and, through integration in key research workflows such as manuscript and grant submission, supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities ensuring that your work is recognized." (orcid.org)

- ORCID iDs are 16 digits and can be expressed as a URL:
 - http://orcid.org/0000-0003-0150-553X
- ORCID profiles can list publications and unpublished yet creditable work.¹
- ORCID is an independent non-profit. Accounts are controlled by the researcher and free!

Funders, Journals


Thousands of journals and funders are collecting ORCIDs during their application and submission processes. Use your ORCID iD to speed form filling and improve discoverability of your work.



Scopus


Authors, have you taken advantage of these Scopus features (numbered in the screenshot below)?

- 1) Register for a personal account on Scopus so that you can:
- 2) Follow this author to receive emails whenever Scopus attributes a new publication to your author profile. You'll know if they misattribute a publication to you and know when properly attributed publications have been processed.
- 3) Get citation alerts to be notified whenever any publications in Scopus cite your publications. This gives you insight on the impact of your work.
- 4) Add to ORCID to create your ORCID if you haven't already done so; add your Scopus publications to your ORCID profile; and submit corrections for your Scopus Author ID.



Scopus Metrics Beyond Citation Counts

Scopus Metrics detail impact beyond citation counts to include scholarly activity and commentary, mass media and social activity.



Jefferson Faculty Profile

The publications on your faculty profile page are powered by Scopus. Correct Scopus to correct your profile.
