The following prizes were awarded by the Dean, Boss V. Patterson, M.D.:

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine, to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to James Shannon Jordan, with honorable mention of Charles Leith Munson and Ernest Hamer Coleman.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery, to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Morris Kesilman, with honorable mention of Joseph Waldman.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the practice of Medicine, to Fook Hing Tong, with honorable mention of Edward Howard Kotin and Edward Philip Swartz.

Therapeutics Prize. By Professor Hare, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to Edward Cecil Guver, with honorable mention of Edward John Gough and Gerald Arthur Cyr.

Surgery Prize, A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to Surgery, to Earl Alfred Daugherty, with honorable mention of Raymond Knight Powell.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Anspach, a Gold Medal for the best Examination and Clinical Report on Gynecology, to Edward Cecil Guyer, with honorable mention of David Pressley Findley and Charles Leith Munson.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Strecker, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Neurology, to Frederick Edward Haentze, with honorable mention of Charles Leith Munson and Leon L. Berns.

Dr. A. Rusling Rainear Prize. Twenty-five Dollars awarded to that student of the Graduating Class who submits the most satisfactory essay upon a subject or question pertaining to Electro-therapeutics appended to the final examination questions, but not constituting a part of the examination, to Henry David Stailey, with honorable mention of Leo Theodore Chylack.

Genito-Urinary Prize. By Professor Stellwagen, a Gold Medal for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to David Armitage Boyd, Jr., with honorable mention of Joseph Anthony Cammarata.

Otology Prize. By Professor Keeler, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Otology, to Charles Leith Munson, with honorable mention of Robert Dickerson Ketchum.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Bauer, Twenty-five Dollars for the best Examination in Pediatrics, to Charles Leith Munson, with honorable mention of Edward Joseph Wagner.

Obstetrics Prize. By Professor Bland, a Gold Medal for the best examination in Obstetrics, to Francis James Braceland.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Shannon, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Ophthalmology, to Walter Harry Caulfield, with honorable mention of Stewart Leeds Rankin and Wynne Metcalf Silbernagel.

Orthopedics Prize. By Professor Rugh, Twenty-five Dollars to the member of the Senior Class presenting the best report of the clinics in Orthopedic Surgery, to Robert Hyatt Brown.

Laryngology Prize. By Professor Lewis, Twenty-five Dollars for general excellence in Laryngology, to Ernest Gerard Smith, with honorable mention of Charles Leith Munson.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal awarded for general excellence in Clinical Surgery in Memory of Francis Torrens Stewart, Professor of Clinical Surgery, Jefferson Medical College, 1910-1920, to Edward Howard Kotin, with honorable mention of Edward Philip Swartz.

W. B. Saunders Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best General Examination at the end of the Senior Year, to Charles Leith Munson.

William Potter Memorial Prize. Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars offered to encourage excellence in the clinical branches of medicine, and awarded to that graduate attaining the highest general average in the final two years of the medical course, to Charles Leith Munson.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the Examinations for the entire curriculum, to Charles Leith Munson.

Reserve Officers' Training Corps Prize. By the Surgeon-General, United States Army. Awarded to the student attaining the highest standing in the four-years' course in Military Science and Tactics, to Joseph Charles Mattas, with honorable mention of Norman Webb White.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay, or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to William Joseph Doyle.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal awarded at the completion of the Sophomore Year to the student who has the highest grade in the anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to James Lowrance Wade, with honorable mention of Herman Finkelstein, Leonard Horn and John Robert Vastine.

D. Appleton & Co. Prize. Fifty Dollars' worth of their Medical Publications to the student who passes the best general examination at the end of the Junior Year, to Kenneth Evans Fry.
