5. Select **Export References** at the bottom of this next **Detailed Search Result** page.

6. **Save this text file** to your computer.
7. In RefWorks, select **References** from the upper left tab and **click Import**.
8. Select **RIS Format** from the **Import Filter/Data Source drop-down** menu and **RIS Format** from the **Database menu**. Upload the saved text file. The downloaded text file, could be the single citation exported file as described in steps 2 and 3, or the multiple citation export from Steps 4 to 6.
9. Choose to add to a New Folder, an existing folder or no folder from Import Into Folder.
10. Click Import in the lower right. The resultant window will indicate the number of reference imported.

11. It is always a good idea to select **View Last Imported Folder** to check that the important fields are populated with the necessary information for inserting in-text citations and creating a reference list.
12. Another method instead of uploading the text file, the text can be pasted by clicking the **From Text** box and then imported.
