The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery to the graduate, in their opinion, most worthy, to Harvey Kenneth Mechanik, with honorable mention of Alan Murray Schaeffer.

Practice Prize. A Gold Medal, awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best essay on a subject pertaining to the Practice of Medicine, to William Walton Kitchin.

Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal, awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best essay on a subject pertaining to Surgery, to James Robert Herron, Jr., with honorable mention of James Joseph O'Leary, Jr.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Anspach, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination and clinical report on Gynecology, to Theophilus Henry Boysen, III, with honorable mention of John Leopold Simon, Richard Lawrence Wagner and Morton Fitch Trippe.

Otology Prize. By Professor Williams, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Otology, to Richard Hoskins Saunders, with honorable mention of Walter Woodrow Crawford.

Clinical Surgery Prize. A Gold Medal for general excellence in Clinical Surgery, in memory of Francis Torrens Stewart, Professor of Clinical Surgery, Jefferson Medical College, 1910-1920, to George Fairless Lull, Jr., with honorable mention of Richard Hoskins Saunders.

Obstetrics Prize. By Professor Vaux, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Obstetrics, to Clyde Abraham Collins, with honorable mention of Robert Boyd Lindsay.

Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Bauer, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Pediatrics, to Francis Xavier Bauer, with honorable mention of Edward Trail Horn, Jr.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Shannon, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Ophthalmology, to Harvey Kenneth Mechanik, with honorable mention of Randolph Victor Seligman and Louis Thomas Gabriel, Jr.

Laryngology Prize. By Professor Clerf, Twenty-five Dollars for general excellence in Laryngology and Bronchoscopy, to Thomas Henry Aughinbaugh, Jr., with honorable mention of Richard Hoskins Saunders.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Alpers, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Neurology, to John Leopold Simon.

Psychiatry Prize. By Clinical Professor Keyes, Twenty-five Dollars for the best examination in Psychiatry, to John Calvin Grier, Jr., with honorable mention of Herbert Alfred Luscombe, Jr.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal for the best examination in Therapeutics, to Richard Lawrence Wagner, with honorable mention of Harold Aloysius Tattersall and Robert Latshaw Walker, III.

W. B. Saunders Company Prize. Seventy-five Dollars' worth of their medical publications to the student who passes the best general examination at the end of the Senior Year, to John Leopold Simon.

William Potter Memorial Prize. The income from a bequest of Mrs. Adaline Potter Wear, not exceeding Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars, offered to encourage excellence in the clinical branches of medicine, and awarded to that graduate attaining the highest general average in the final two years of the medical course, to Alan Murray Schaeffer.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best general average gained in the examinations for the entire curriculum, to Harvey Kenneth Mechanik.

Physiology Prize. A Gold Medal, awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best essay, or the best examination, on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the Second Year), to Thomas Michael Scarcaciottoli.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal, awarded upon the completion of the Sophomore Year, to the student who has the highest grade in the Anatomical subjects of the Freshman and Sophomore Years, to John Anthony Pfister, with honorable mention of Willis Edmund Manges and Wasy James Polischuk.

D. Appleton-Century Company Prize. Fifty Dollars' worth of their medical publications to the student who passes the best general examination at the end of the Junior Year, to Frederick Balthas Wagner, Jr.

Schaeffer Anatomic League Prize. A Gold Medal, awarded by Professor Schaeffer, to the member of the League presenting the best thesis in the science of Anatomy, including Embryology, Histology, and Comparative Anatomy, to Frank Thomas O'Brien.
