





LH: My name is Lois Highsmith. That is my married name. Biographical background, let's see. African American female, born and raised in Philadelphia. I went to school, high school, at Martin Luther King High School. Graduated, midway top of my class, not top. I'm a mother of two daughters. Um, who are very smart too {LG}. What else do you want to know? Tell me. Like what?

KD: Yeah, I mean, maybe a little overview of your career path, where you went after Jefferson.

LH: I started. I started at Penn State. I went to Penn State for two years, like I said I started, I got accepted to college, eh, I didn't want to go to college. Really, I didn't. But I got, I had nothing to do when I graduated high school {LG}. I really, I really didn't want to go. My professor convinced me to study chemistry because I was good in chemistry, so that's what I studied. Chemical engineering. Bored out of my mind. I just was bored {LG}. So I changed my major. I really, I liked nursing, in my mind, because I used to watch General Hospital {LG}.

LH: That's why I wanted to be a nurse, really. I liked helping people and I thought nursing was what I wanted to do. Letter from Oliver B. Green and S. P. Green to John P. Green, July 4, 1860 [John P. Green Mss. -- A.L.S.]

Dear Bro. John

It comes out that this national holiday finds me here Last year same. & I were travelling in Ill. & reached the southern end of that state at evg. This year with my wife Louisa & two children Mary Pomerov 3 yrs old & Olivia Pomeroy 7 mos, old. We are at this hospitable corner enjoying as we may the society of all the sisters save Jo & of A.H.G. cause of thanksgiving all the way along we have. I was in Chicago & about two weeks ago brought hence my little family whom in Febry. I left in Southern Illinois with a sister of Louisa's. I am doing a little here to keep things going till things matters pick up in the W. so as to warrant our being there - which time I hope will soon come, as I like the W. for a home. Sisters are very kind and so is A.H.G. whose interest in the family remains still strong. News of the day here covers the Great Eastern's arrival, 680 ft. long & every way big in proportions. Much we shd. find to talk of should we meet I do not doubt but to write news or items of interest to you who never get the letters, or if you get them, about never answer them. Allow me to kindly ask, what pleasure you suppose it to be to us to write year after year, mail by mail, & yet have you let mail after mail go by, without your sending us even your signature. You have been gone some dozen years & yet have never even by intimation told us whether you have saved a dollar or a fortune, a matter of less consequence to us than to know you are happy, contented, living a yourself-useful life, & [pre?ing] by a life of faith & active service





#### Jefferson Digital Commons (JDC) Quarterly Report: January-March 2017

The JDC is off to a great start for 2017 with over 300 new assets added including the first Global Research Day hosted at Jefferson, a variety of Grand Rounds from numerous departments, podcasts, posters and continued feedback from users from around the world finding useful content in the JDC.

#### JDC Quarterly Report October-December 2016

The <u>Jefferson Digital Commons</u> (JDC) had a great 2016. On December 14, 2016 the JDC reached a new milestone by passing the 3 million download mark along with the deposit of more than 12.000 assets to date.

In addition, new Departments joining the JDC include:

- Neurosurgery Grand Rounds
- Jefferson Sleep Center

Here are some statistics from 2016 to share:

- Total assets added in 2016: 1,493
- 18,280 different institutions accessed content in the JDC
   -43% Education, 30% commercial, 16% Organization, 8% government, 3% other
- 215 countries visited the JDC
- March 2016 generated the most downloads with 43,493
- Total downloads for 2016: 467,382
