#### DOCTOR OF LAWS-ALBERT JOHN NESBITT

Albert John Nesbitt, while born in Philadelphia, received his primary and secondary education in Atlantic City, New Jersey. After graduating from the Drexel Institute of Technology in 1921, he joined the John J. Nesbitt Company and spent his entire business and professional career with them. He retired as President and Chairman of the Board in

A most important part of Mr. Nesbitt's life has been his deep interest in the education, training, and recreational activities of America's youth. He has been an active member of the Board of Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University, Thomas Jefferson University, Villanova University, St. Joseph's College, the University City Science Center, the Metropolitan YMCA of Philadelphia, and the Philadelphia Council of Boy Scouts. In recognition of this, St. Joseph's College, Ursinus College, and Springfield College in Massachusetts have each awarded him an honorary degree. His devotion and loyalty to his alma mater, Drexel University, is recognized throughout the academic community. He has served her well as a member and chairman of the Board of Trustees, and was awarded an honorary degree in 1952. He has shown a great interest in educational television and served as Chairman of the Board of WHYY, Inc., TV-12.

Mr. Nesbitt has received over thirty national and local awards in recognition of his efforts and achievements, mainly in behalf of others. A few of these include "Man of the Year" by the Northwest Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, the Golden Deeds Award of the Exchange Club of Philadelphia, the Old York Road B'nai B'rith Americanism Award, the Annual National Human Relations Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the Junior Chamber of Commerce Brotherhood Award, Big Brother of the Year, the Youth Award of the Chapel of the Four Chaplains, the Silver Beaver and Silver Antelope Awards of the Boy Scouts of America, the Crime Commission's Citizen Action

the Silver Beaver and Silver Antelope Awards of the Boy Scouts of America, the Crime Commission's Citizen Action Award, and the Fellowship Award for Human Relations.

He served his country in World War II as an Industry Member of the Regional National War Labor Board and was awarded a citation by the War Department for his services. He has held a number of important civic leadership positions with such organizations as the United Fund, the Commission on Human Relations in the City of Philadelphia, the Governor's Committee on Public Television, and the Pennsylvania General Assembly Commission for Legislative

Mr. Nesbitt is a past President of the Philadelphia Council of Churches, and was cited by this group for outstanding Christian services. He has served as a member of the vestry in several Episcopal churches.

#### DOCTOR OF SCIENCE—ANDREW JACKSON RAMSAY

Andrew Jackson Ramsay was born in Indiana where he received his primary education in a one-room school house. He earned his bachelor's degree at DePauw University and his doctor of philosophy degree at Cornell University.

His special interest in histology and embryology led him to remain at Cornell for several years.

In 1936 Dr. Ramsay joined the faculty of Jefferson Medical College at the urging of Professor J. Parsons Schaeffer, the Chairman of the Department of Anatomy. He was immediately recognized as a superb educator and was rapidly promoted, attaining the rank of Professor of Histology and Embryology in 1948. A truly remarkable teacher, he has left his mark on over 6,000 Jefferson alumni during his thirty-six years of teaching. In 1958 he was appointed Chairman of the Department of Anatomy and Director of the Daniel Baugh Institute of Anatomy of Jefferson Medical College and remained as such until his retirement in 1972.

Dr. Ramsay holds memberships in many professional organizations and honorary societies. He is a member of Alpha Omega Alpha, Sigma Xi, and for many years served as a member of the Anatomical Board of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and was its President from 1966 to 1972. He has served as a consultant to numerous medical publishers and has contributed to Morris' "Human Anatomy" as well as many textbooks of histology and embryology.

Dr. Ramsay has recorded many other achievements—a track star in college, he won the Penn Relays in 1928; a pioneer in the use of television in medical education; a student of the origin and recognition of embryonic tissue; an innovator in teaching and curriculum adjustment and development; and a respected photographer. He shall best be remembered in the Annals of Jefferson however for his intense interest and devotion to his adopted institution. He was for many years the Marshal of Academics of the University. Few alumni remember the words of their graduation speaker, but few will forget the words of counsel given by Dr. Ramsay during rehearsal on graduation morning at the Academy of Music. He was honored by his students in 1966 when the graduating class commissioned the painting of his portrait for presentation to the College—one of the highest honors bestowed upon a member of the faculty of

Although officially retired, he has continued to serve actively in the affairs of Jefferson but now also has time to pursue some of his hobbies of fishing, wilderness camping, mountain climbing, and photography. He and his wife, the former Sara Passmore Sharpless, live in Medford Lakes, New Jersey—close to the native setting they enjoy so much.

#### DOCTOR OF SCIENCE—JOSHUA MONTGOMERY DEAVER

Joshua Montgomery Deaver, son of a distinguished surgeon, was born in Wyncote, Pennsylvania, at the turn of the century. He earned his varsity "Y" in football and bachelor's degree from Yale University, and his doctor of medicine degree from the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Deaver spent his entire professional career in association with the Lankenau Hospital of Philadelphia. From

1928 to 1934 he served his internship and residency in surgery there and then joined the staff where he subsequently rose to Chief of the General Surgical Service. He retired from his administrative duties in 1967, and now serves as a

Senior Consultant in Surgery.

Dr. Deaver joined the faculty of Jefferson Medical College in 1949 and over the years has taught skillfully and gained the respect and influenced scores of Jefferson students. He became Professor of Clinical Surgery in 1964 and is at present an Honorary Clinical Professor of Surgery. He is also an Emeritus Professor of Clinical Surgery on the faculty of the Graduate School of the University of Pennsylvania.

As a distinguished physician and teacher, he has been a consultant to many organizations and has contributed over forty scientific articles to the surgical literature. He is a member and past President of the Philadelphia Academy of Surgery, and a member of the American Surgical Association, the International Society of Surgeons, and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and the College of Physicians of Philadelphia.

Dr. Deaver served his country in two wars—as a Private in the Marine Corps in World War I, and for four years as a Navy Medical Officer during World War II in the South Pacific. He was awarded the Bronze Star in 1944 for distinguished service.

#### DOCTOR OF SCIENCE—DAVID ELLIOTT ROGERS

A native of New York City, David Elliott Rogers received his doctor of medicine degree at Cornell University Medical College in 1948. His internship and a year of residency in internal medicine were served at the Johns Hopkins Hospital. He continued his training in internal medicine and infectious diseases at the New York Hospital—Cornell Medical Center, later serving as a Visiting Investigator and Lowell M. Palmer Senior Fellow in Medicine at the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research. His training years were interrupted by a tour of military service in the United

States Navy during the Korean conflict.
Following the completion of his military service, he returned to the New York Hospital—Cornell Medical Center and rose rapidly in scientific stature and academic rank. He was appointed an Associate Professor of Medicine and Chief of the Division of Infectious Diseases in 1956.

At the age of only thirty-three, Dr. Rogers was selected to become Professor of Medicine and Chairman of the Department of Medicine at the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, and Physician-in-Chief at the Vanderbilt University Hospital. He remained there for ten years and then returned to the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine as Professor of Medicine, Dean of the Medical Faculty, Vice President of the University, and Medical Director of the Johns Hopkins Hospital.

He has been an active member of numerous societies, including Sigma Xi, Alpha Omega Alpha, American Society

He has been an active member of numerous societies, including Sigma Xi, Alpha Omega Alpha, American Society for Clinical Investigation, Association of American Physicians, Infectious Disease Society of America, American Clinical and Climatological Association, American College of Physicians, and the Cosmos Club. In addition, he has served as a Special Consultant to the Surgeon General on Staphylococcal Diseases, and Chairman of the Staphylococcal Section of the Streptococcal—Staphylococcal Disease Commission of the Armed Forces Epidemiological Board.

He has served as a member on numerous editorial boards, including those of Clinical Research, Medicine, and the Year Book of Medicine, and has received appointments to a number of standing advisory boards. Because of his ongoing and outstanding contributions to the knowledge of Infectious Diseases, he has been invited to be a Visiting Professor in over thirty universities in the United States and abroad. Dr. Rogers has published almost one hundred scientific papers and in 1971 was appointed President of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation in Princeton, New Jersey.

#### THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The wearing of academic dress dates back to the early days of the oldest universities in the world. In the American Council on Education's book entitled "American Universities and Colleges" it is suggested that "gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served

to cover the tonsured head . . "

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities, on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress about fifty years ago, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by almost all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the Bachelors, Masters, and Doctors and at the same time recognize the university which has given them the degree.

The Bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves and is worn closed. The Master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away, and is worn open or closed. The Doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn opened or closed. Cotton poplin or similar material is used for the Bachelor's and Master's degrees, and rayon or silk ribbed material is used for the Doctor's degree.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the Doctor's degree, 42 inches for the Master's, and 36 inches for the Bachelor's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the hood is usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted.

Black mortarboards are worn for all degrees.
