The project

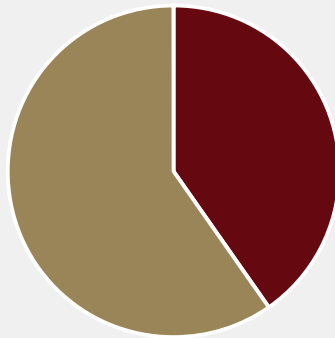

76 students participated in the study.



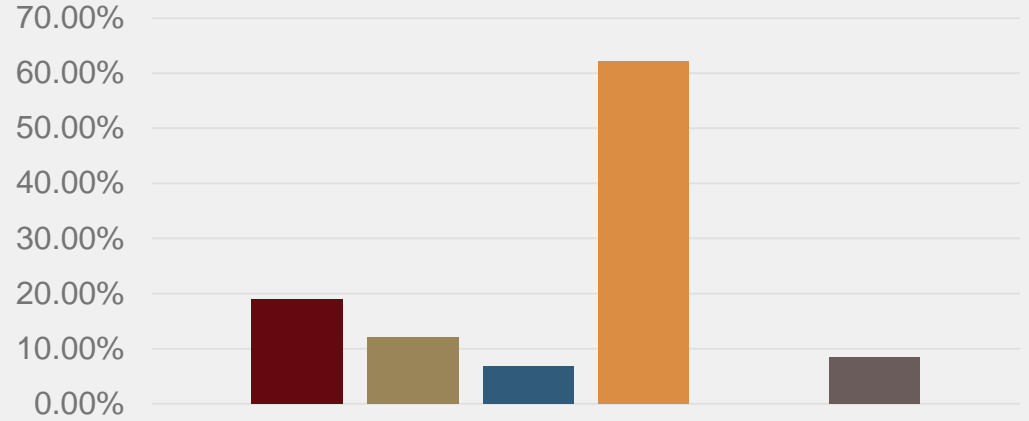

Gender



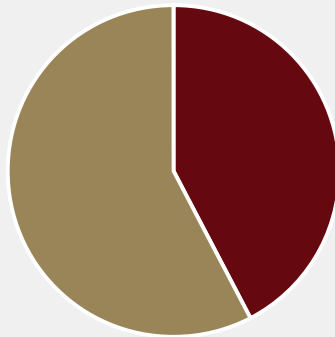
■ Male ■ Female

Race and Ethnicity



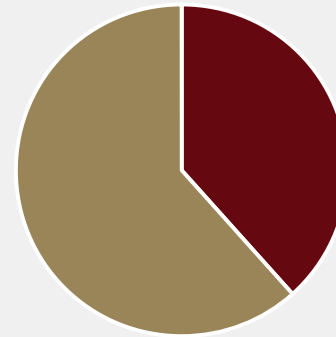
■ Asian ■ Black or African American ■ Other ■ White ■ Hispanic

Disadvantaged background



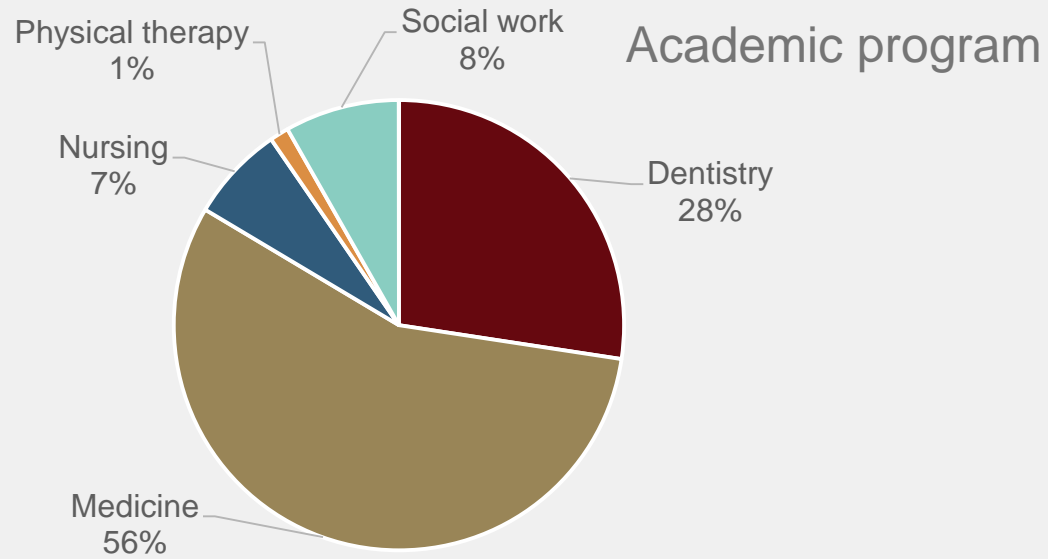

Geographic background

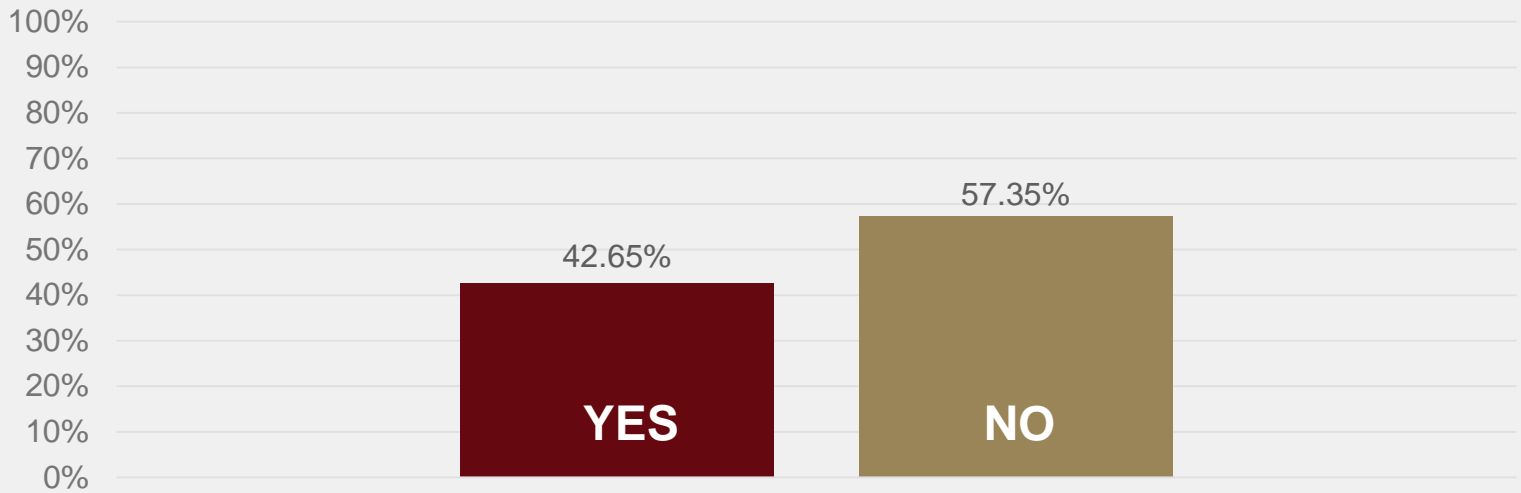


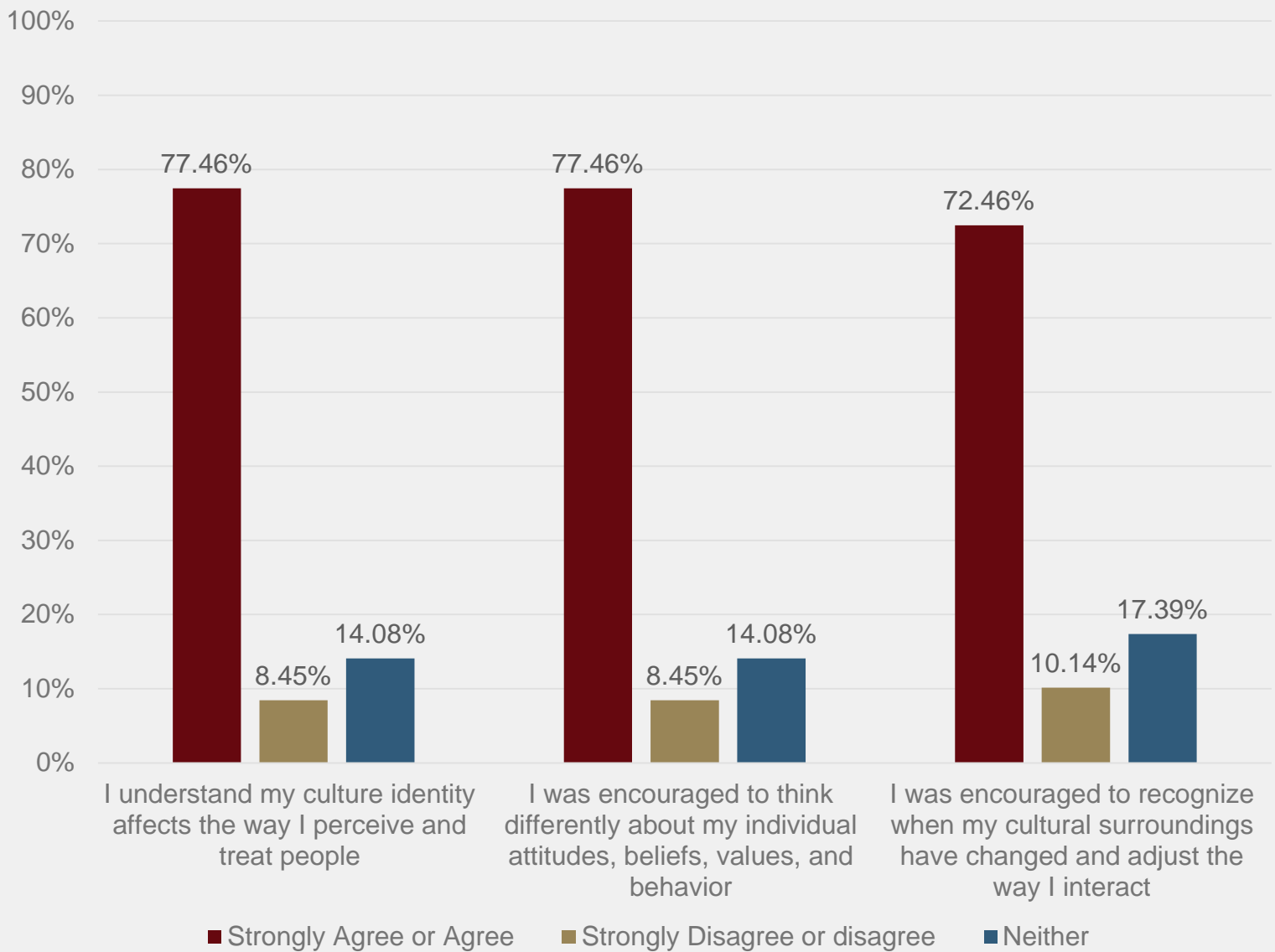

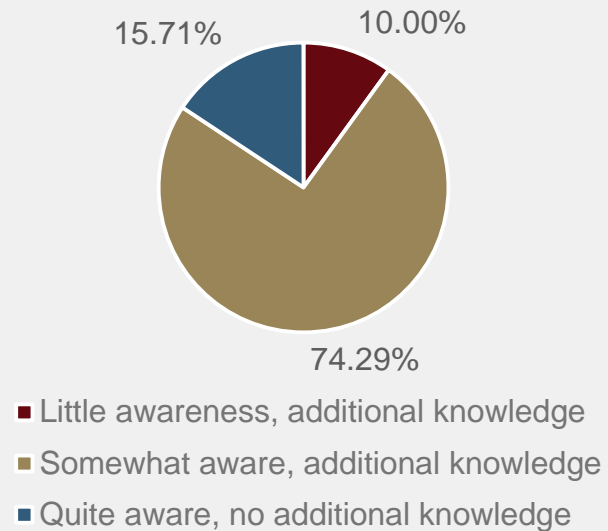


Did you have work experience in the healthcare field prior to enrolling in your current academic program?

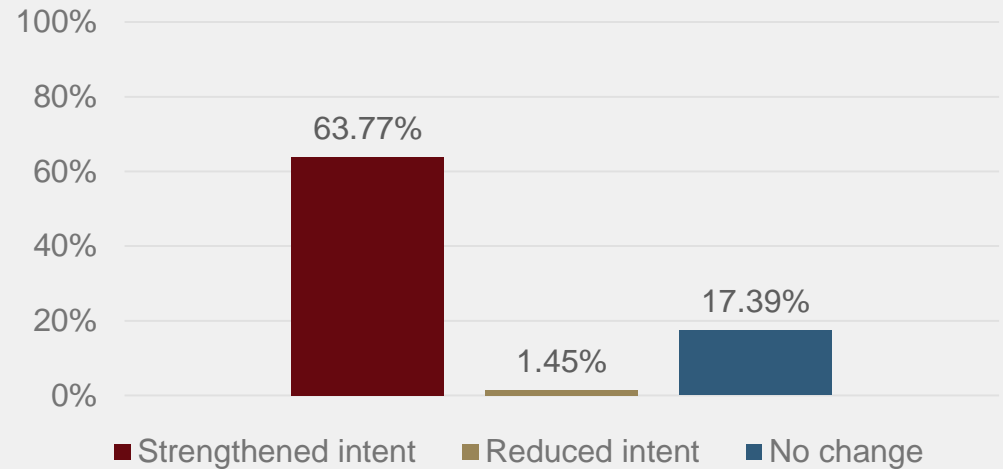




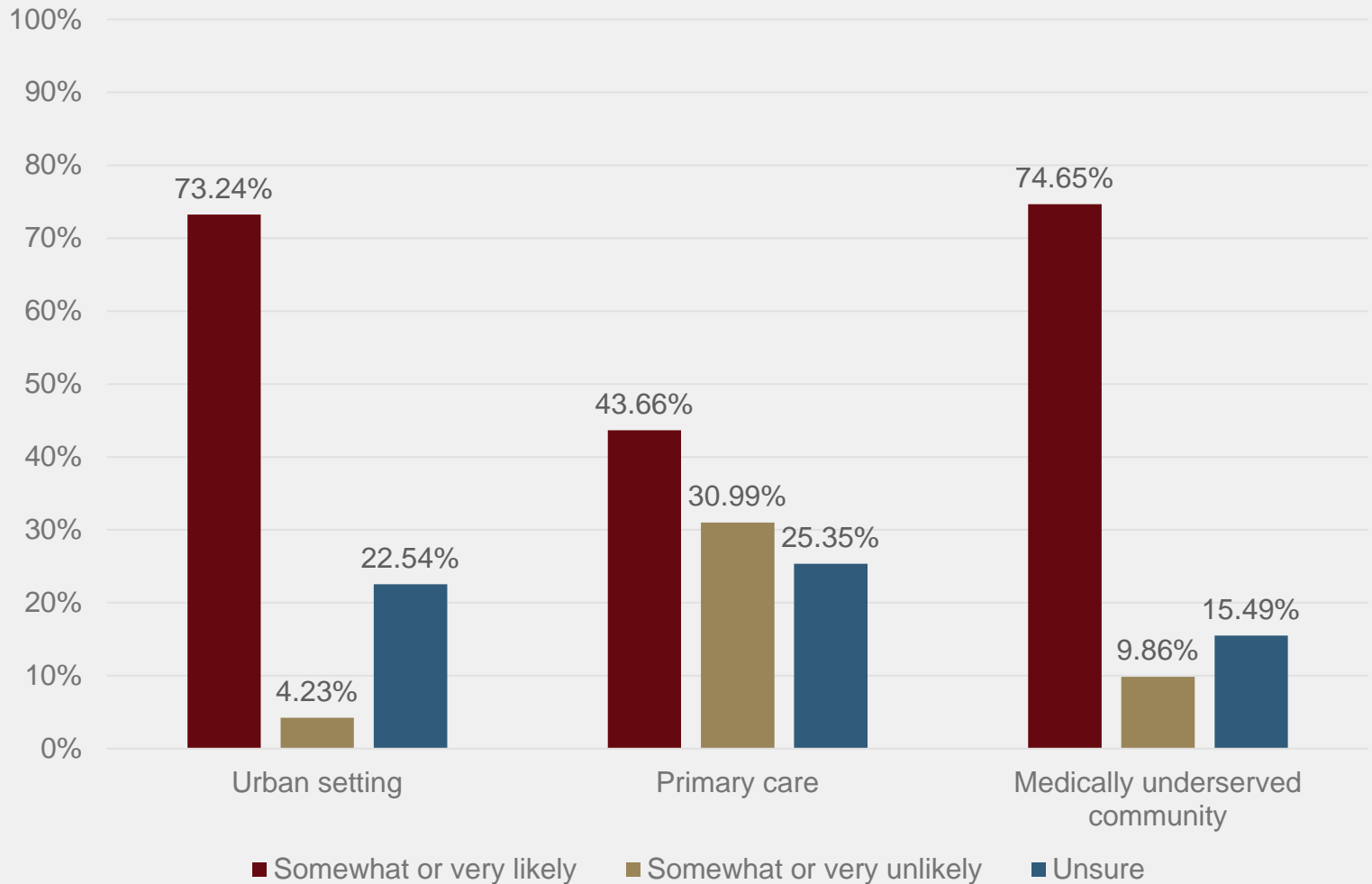

Which of the following statements best describe the impact of your experience at the IUSOC on your intention to provide care in primary care, rural, or medically underserved communities when you complete your education?

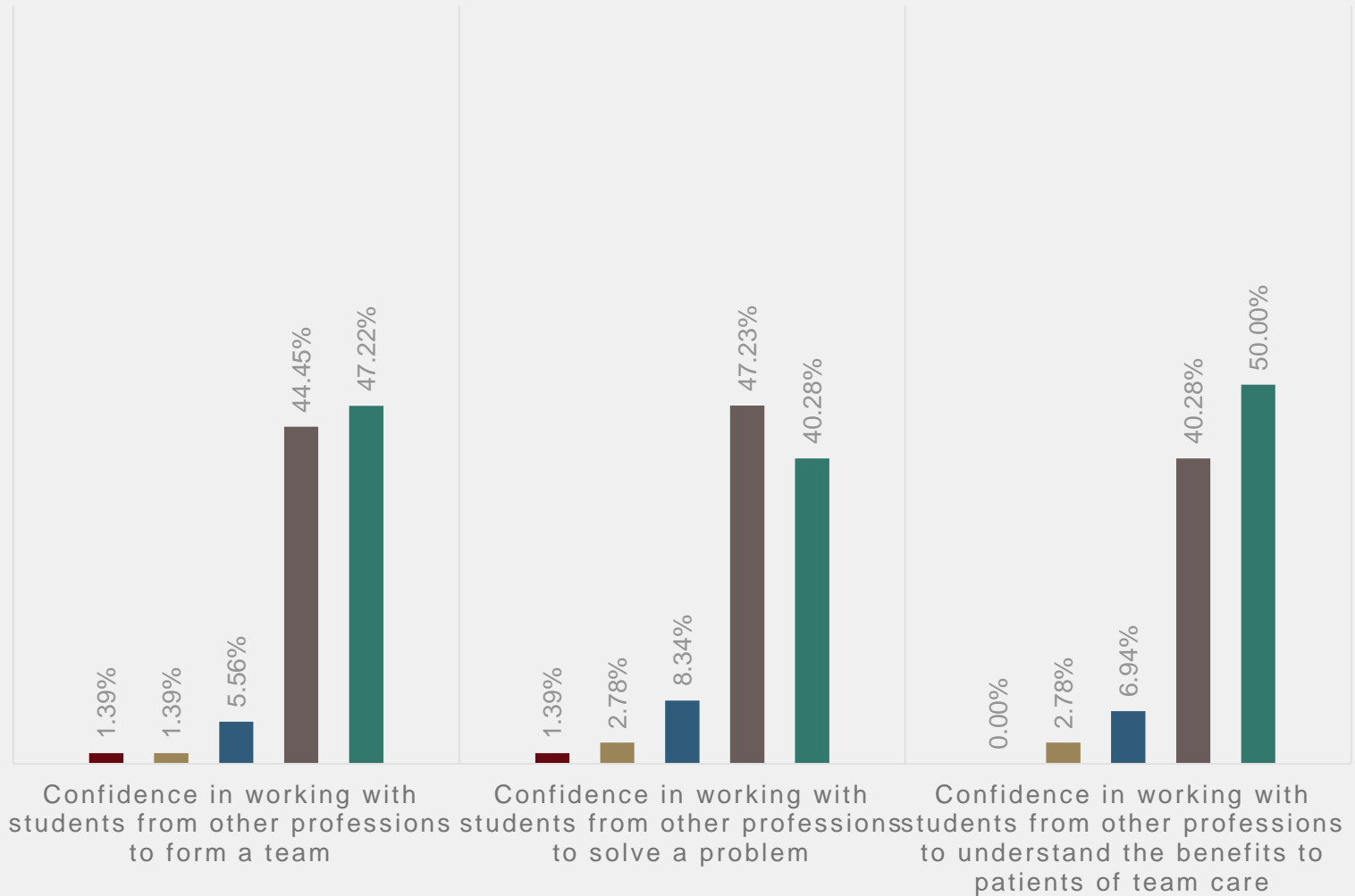

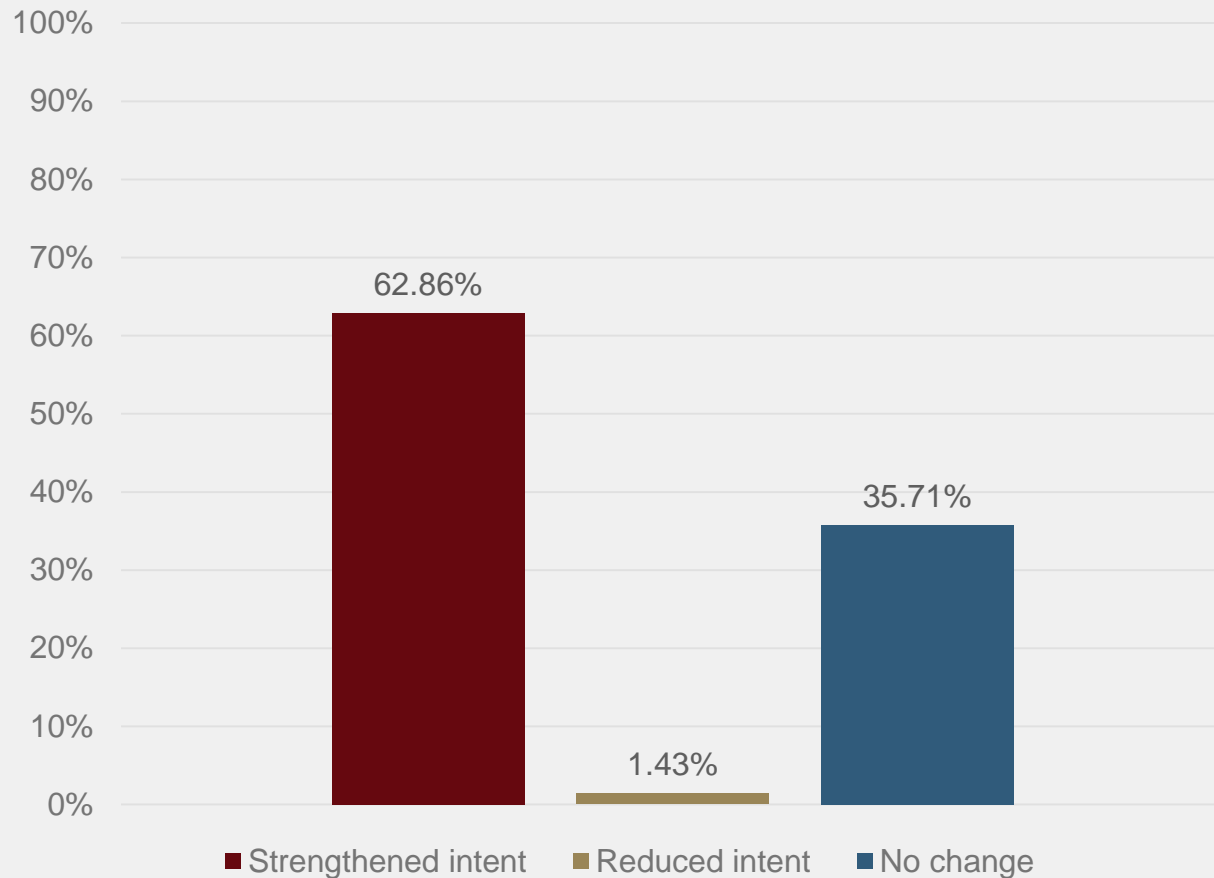
