DOCTOR OF LETTERS—MARIAN ANDERSON

Marian Anderson, a world famous contralto, was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and educated in the Philadelphia school system.

Her musical talents were recognized at an early age. As a six-year-old child, she sang in the Union Baptist Church Choir in Philadelphia, and a fund raised by the members of her church enabled her to begin her musical training. In addition to Giuseppe Boghetti in Philadelphia, she studied with noted vocal coaches in England and in Continental Europe.

Miss Anderson's early appearances included concerts at Witherspoon Hall in Philadelphia and Town Hall in New York. In 1925 she won a competition for an appearance with the New York Philharmonic at the Lewisohn Stadium, which helped to launch an extraordinary concert career. She toured extensively in Europe and in the United States. The highlights of her career included concerts in 1935 at Town Hall and Carnegie Hall in New York, an appearance in 1939 at Lincoln Memorial in Washington for an audience of 75,000, her debut in 1955 in "Un Ballo in Maschera" at the Metropolitan Opera, and performances at the inaugural balls of Presidents Eisenhower and Kennedy in 1957 and 1961.

Miss Anderson has been decorated and honored by the governments of a number of foreign countries and numerous states and cities in the United States. More than twenty universities have conferred honorary degrees upon her and she received the coveted Bok Award in 1940.

Marian Anderson has served her country not only as a gifted performing artist, but also as the United States delegate to the 13th General Assembly of the United Nations.

She is married to Orpheus H. Fisher and resides in Danbury, Connecticut.

His awards and honors are numerous and include the Outstanding Teacher Award and the distinguished Faculty Service Award at the University of Michigan as well as the Clark Kerr Award from the University of California at Berkeley and a Citation by the San Francisco Conference on Religion, Race, and Social Concern for outstanding community leadership as an educator, churchman, and citizen.

Dr. Heyns served in the United States Army Air Force during World War II. He is married and the father of three children.

DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS—ARTHUR COBLENS KAUFMANN

Arthur C. Kaufmann was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and received his education in the public schools of Pittsburgh. He entered the business world after completion of his education, and for 25 years was associated with Gimbel Brothers, Inc., rising to the position of the Executive Head of Gimbels, Philadelphia, Vice-President and Director of Gimbel Brothers, Inc., President of Gimbel Brothers Bank and Trust Company of Philadelphia, and Chairman of the Board of WIP Radio. Following this distinguished career in business, he organized the Management Consultant Firm of Arthur C. Kaufmann and Associates and is the President and Chairman of the Board.

Mr. Kaufmann is well known for his interest and expertise in labor matters and serves as a member of the United States Labor Management Committee and was a member of the War Manpower Commissions Management—Labor Committee in the Philadelphia area.

A most important part of Mr. Kaufmann's life has been his deep and abiding interest in the civic and philanthropic affairs of our country, our state, and in particular the City of Philadelphia.

He now serves as a member of the Commonwealth's Bicentennial Commission and as Chairman of the Advisory Commission, Independence National Historical Park.

During his career, he has shown a continued interest in medicine and health affairs having served as a member of the Board of Governors of the Medical College of Pennsylvania; a Trustee of the Lankenau Hospital in Philadelphia; and a Board member of the Heart Association of Southeastern Pennsylvania. He was the Chairman of the 1970 Philadelphia Heart Drive and the State Chairman of the 1972 Heart Fund.

Mr. Kaufmann has served his country for over two decades as Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army and as Chairman of the National Defense Civilian Advisory Committee in the Eastern Pennsylvania Military District. He has been the recipient of numerous awards for patriotism by military organizations and was awarded an honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters by Temple University. He has also received distinguished service awards from a number of foreign countries including Belgium, the Netherlands, France, and Italy.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE—JAMES ALBERT MICHENER

James Albert Michener, a most distinguished American author, received a Bachelor of Arts degree, *summa cum laude*, from Swarthmore College where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He earned a Master of Arts degree from the University of North Colorado and then continued his studies at a number of universities in this country and abroad during which time he was a Lippincott Traveling Fellow. Subsequently he taught at the Hill School and the George School and was appointed Professor, Colorado State College of Education, and a Visiting Professor at Harvard University.

Mr. Michener's reputation as an author is known throughout the world. He won the Pulitzer Prize for the memorable "Tales of the South Pacific" in 1947 and since then has written over 20 renowned works, including "The Bridges at Toko Ri", "Sayonara", "Caravans", "Hawaii", "Presidential Lottery", "Kent State", and "Centennial". He received the Overseas Press Club Award for Best Journalism Reports for "The Bridge at Andau" in 1957. He is now conducting research on a new book which in part relates to the health of our society.

He has served as the President of the Pennsylvania Electoral College, as Secretary of the Pennsylvania Constitutional Convention, as a member of the Advisory Committee on Arts for the United States State Department, and as a member of the United States Advisory Commission on Information.

Mr. Michener served with the United States Navy in the Pacific Theater of Operations during World War II and received the Navy Distinguished Public Service Award in 1959. He was named "Outstanding Pennsylvanian" in 1967 and has received numerous honorary degrees from American universities.

DOCTOR OF LAWS—JO ONO

Jo Ono is a distinguished alumnus of Jefferson Medical College. He was born in Japan and came to the United States at an early age to complete high school. He then pursued his premedical education at Lafayette College in Easton, Pennsylvania, and matriculated in Jefferson Medical College, graduating in 1928. Dr. Ono interned in the Jefferson Hospital and subsequently spent a year in special study in pulmonary diseases at the Pennsylvania State Sanitarium at Mont Alto. This was followed by two years of residency in bronchoesophagology under Professor Louis H. Clerf of Jefferson.

Dr. Ono returned to his native land where he has been very instrumental in organizing and establishing the discipline of bronchoesophagology. He has served as the President of the Japan Bronchoesophagology Society, as President of the International Bronchoesophagological Society, and as the President of the Ninth and Eleventh International Congresses of Bronchoesophagology. He established the Japanese Chapter of the American College of Chest Physicians and has served as the Regent for Japan.

A noted teacher of his specialty, he developed a number of post graduate seminars and congresses in bronchoesophagology in his country and throughout the Far East. He has contributed over 100 papers and books to the medical literature and has translated into the Japanese language a number of standard textbooks in bronchoesophagology.

Dr. Ono has been honored by his country for his contributions to medicine and has received the Imperial Decoration of the Sacred Treasure of the Third Order. He has received an honorary degree from his Alma Mater, Lafayette College, and from Keio University School of Medicine in Japan. He has also been awarded several gold medals for his contributions to bronchoesophagology.

Dr. Ono is married and resides in Tokyo, Japan.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The wearing of academic dress dates back to the early days of the oldest universities in the world. In the American Council on Education's book entitled "American Universities and Colleges" it is suggested that "gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head . . ."

Throughout the years European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. American universities, on the other hand, when they decided to adopt academic dress about sixty years ago, immediately established a code of regulations which today is followed by almost all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish the Associates, Bachelors, Masters, and Doctors and at the same time recognize the university which has given them the degree.

The Associate in Arts and Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are worn closed. The Master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away, and is worn open or closed. The Doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn opened or closed. Cotton poplin or similar material is used for the Associate's, Bachelor's and Master's degrees, and rayon or silk ribbed material is used for the Doctor's degree. All gowns are black except for the Associate in Arts degree which is gray.

The hoods vary in length: 48 inches for the Doctor's degree, 42 inches for the Master's, and 36 inches for the Bachelor's and Associate's. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the Doctor's, Master's and Bachelor's hoods are usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted. The Associate of Arts hood has no velvet border. The outside is black.

Black mortarboards are worn for all degrees.

Some of the colors in the bindings of the hoods are:
