

Special Libraries Association Engineering Division Announces The Inspec Travel Stipend Award (\$1,200) For the SLA Annual Meeting in Denver CO, 3-6 June 2007

Inspec is sponsoring their annual award of a \$1,200.00 travel stipend for a library school student toward payment of expenses incurred while attending their first annual Special Libraries Association conference, to be held in Denver CO, June 3-6, 2007.

The Inspec Award will be given to the qualified student who submits the best essay of three or less double-spaced typed pages describing the following topic:

If you were a Librarian in charge of the science or engineering collections, how would you go about promoting databases within your collection to the appropriate departments that can benefit from them? What could the database producers do to assist in your efforts (e.g., send you promotional items, etc.). Explain how your efforts will benefit your organization.

Qualifications for Entering the Award Competition:

- 1. Be a student member of the Special Libraries Association.
- 2. Be attending his or her first SLA Conference.

Special Instructions:

- 1. Give your full name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, and a statement, on one page, of your qualifications, as given above, for entering the award competition. Include the name of your library school.
- 2. Type your full name (without any additional personal information) at the top of each essay page. Double space the typing on all pages.

Deadline for Submission: March 1

The recipient of the Inspec Award will be notified by April 1.

Looking at the News Connections site, at http://www.sla.org/content/resources/lin/index.cfm in late October, I found many very recent articles posted by Factiva for free full text reading. These were organized in eight categories that included Blogging, RSS and Wikis; Security and Information; and Copyright.

The Nexcerpt News Connection contains selections made by Carolyn Sosnowski on current online information. For example - NPR Morning Edition, Thu, Oct 26, 2006 – "Los Angeles Boy Scouts Learn Copyright Law."

If you're more of an audio person, the Podcast Center features included an interview with NewsGator's Todd Berkowitz, a report from SLA President Rebecca Vargas on the Board's Meetings held at Internet Librarian, and a tour of the SLA Website from Carolyn Sosnowki (one of her monthly podcasts.)

All good stuff, and definitely worth further investigation. SLA is doing its best to keep us informed. Let's do our part by using these resources and giving HQ feedback on the pros and cons of each.
