Department of Health Policy Offers Physician Fellowship in OUTCOMES RESEARCH

For over a decade, the Department of Health Policy (DHP) has offered outcomes research fellowships for Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) graduates. Through the program, felows learn to design, implement, and communicate the results of outcomes research studies and develop an understanding of policy implications.

In 2004, DHP partnered with GlaxoSmithKline to offer a physician outcomes research fellowship. The program consists of two years of post-graduate training. During the first year, the fellow will work under the mentorship of Dr. Nash at our office in Center Ctp. Philadelphia. The fellow's pimary role will be to serve as a member of the DHP Research Group. The fellow will also be encouraged to take classes in epidemiology, biostatistics, research design, and health policy and will have the opportunity to attend and present at DHP's short course, research meetings, journal durb, health policy forums, and sponsored educational programs. Writing akils will be developed through publication of the fellow's research projects and authorship of articles for the peer-reviewed journals. During the second year, the fellow will work as a researcher within the Global Health Dutomes department of GlaxoSmithKline, located in the Philodelphia area. A competitive stigend is provided.



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
