I hope I didn't miss anyone when I notified DMRM members of the result of our vote and the DCHE vote via e-mail and letter. I used the current online directory each time, but I suspect errors in that.

I hope all of you, including those who didn't vote, will consider volunteering for one of the committees of DCHE. Betsey Aldridge is on the "merger" committee with me. She is also working on the roundtable session on Six Sigma for the 2006 conference in Baltimore. I hope our other committee chairs will volunteer for their counterpart committee in DCHE.
