HONORARY DEGREE

The honorary degree of Doctor of Science was conferred upon Dr. Charles Finlay, of Havana, Cuba, a graduate of this College of 1855, in recognition of his contributions to the Science of Medicine with reference to the causation of Yellow Fever.

PRIZES

The following prizes were awarded:

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professor of Medicine to the graduate in his opinion most worthy, to George Hancock Nofer, of Pennsylvania.

The Henry M. Phillips Prize of Seventy-five Dollars. Awarded upon the recommendation of the Professors of Surgery to the graduate in their opinion most worthy, to Philip Henry Moore, of Maine.

Physiology Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay or the best Examination on a subject pertaining to Physiology (open to undergraduates of the second year), to Undergraduate Leonard Bershad, of Pennsylvania.

Practice of Medicine Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Essay on a subject pertaining to the Practice of Medicine, to Max R. Dinkelspiel, of New York, with honorable mention of Louis Spitz, of Pennsylvania.

Surgery Prize. Awarded by bequest of Dr. Francis W. Shain, for the best Examination in Surgery, to Alfred Heineberg, of Alabama.

Therapeutics Prize. A Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Therapeutics, to William McKay Davis, of Pennsylvania.

Obstetrical Prize. A Gold Medal, for General Excellence in Obstetrics, to Joseph Allen Maclay, of New Jersey.

Anatomy Prize. A Gold Medal for the best Anatomical Preparation (open to undergraduates), to Undergraduate John Forsythe Little, of Pennsylvania.

Pathology Prize. A Gold Medal, for the best Research Work in Pathology, to Lewis Hugh McKinnie, of Colorado.

Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor De Schweinitz, a Gold Medal for the best Examination on Ophthalmology, to Clarence Francis Ely, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of William McCay Davis, of Pennsylvania, and Edward Gyles, of New York.

Gynecology Prize. By Professor Montgomery, a Gold Medal, for the best Examination in Gynecology, to William McCay Davis, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of Philip Henry Moore, of Maine, and George Hancock Nofer, of Pennsylvania.

The W. S. Forbes Anatomical League Prize of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars given by Professor Forbes to the member of the Anatomical League having the highest standing in a competitive Examination in Anatomy, to Harry Edward Kirschner, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of Granville Walker, of Pennsylvania, and George W. Lincoln, of Pennsylvania.

Neurology Prize. By Professor Dercum, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Neurology, to Percy S. Pelouze, of New Jersey, with honorable mention of E. Edwin Bell, of Pennsylvania, and Joseph Allen McClay, of New Jersey.

Clinical Orthopedics Prize. By Professor H. Augustus Wilson, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Orthopedic Surgery, to Rein K. Hartzell, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of George H. Nofer, of Pennsylvania.

Clinical Pediatrics Prize. By Professor Graham, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report on his Clinics, divided between Otto Kerr Snyder, of Wyoming, and Max R. Dinkelspiel, of New York.

Clinical Genito Urinary Prize. By Professor Horwitz, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Genito-Urinary Surgery, to Robert Golden Carlin, of Pennsylvania.

Clinical Obstetrics Prize. By Professor Davis, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of his Clinics, to Samuel Eldrige Irving of New Jersey, with honorable mention of Milton Ellsworth Hartman, of Pennsylvania, and Otto Kerr Snyder, of Wyoming.

Clinical Ophthalmology Prize. By Professor Hansell, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of his Clinics, to Edward William Barrett, of Massachusetts.

Clinical Otology Prize. By Professor S. MacCuen Smith, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Otology, to Philip Atlee Sheaff, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of Joseph Alan Maclay, of New Jersey.

Clinical Dermatology Prize. By Professor Stelwagon, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Examination in Dermatology, to Philip Atlee Sheaff, of Pennsylvania, with honorable mention of Alfred Heineberg, of Alabama.

Clinical Laryngology Prize. By Professor Jones, Twenty-five Dollars, for the best Report of his Clinics, to Joseph Alan Maclay, of New Jersey.

Alumni Prize. By the Alumni Association, a Medal for the best General average gained in the examinations for the entire curriculum, to George Hancock Nofer, of Pennsylvania.

W. B. Saunders Prize. Eighteen Volumes of Saunders' Medical Hand Atlases, to the student who passes the best General Examination at the close of the college term, to Philip Henry Moore, of Maine.

Out-Patient Department Obstetric Prize. By Dr. W. H. Wells, Demonstrator of Clinical Obstetrics, a Case of Instruments, for the best Report of work in out-patient maternity service, to Alfred Heineberg, of Alabama with honorable mention of Max R. Dinkelspiel, of New York.
